This month's theme has to do with growth and renewal, first as a church and then as an individual. All the books have been donated. The first, *Recruiting Volunteers* by Dan Entwistle is a good resource for recruiting, training, and sustaining volunteers.

Bill Hybels (Willow Creek Community Church) is the author of *Holy Discontent: Fueling The Fire That Ignites Personal Vision*. Hybels asks us to consider the enormous force for good that our life can become when it is powered and guided by holy discontent. He also shows what it takes to turn this holy discontent into purposeful and effective action.

The third book by Craig Groeschel is *How Churches And Leaders Can Get It And Keep It.* In his ministry the author has come across a powerful life changing force he has come to call It. Combining honesty with humor this book undertakes to help people understand the elements needed to obtain It.


Evangelicals On the Canterbury Trail by Robert E. Webber tells why evangelicals are attracted to the liturgical church. What is a man who is a theology professor from an evangelical college, an ordained Presbyterian minister, a graduate of Bob Jones University, and the son of a Baptist minister doing in the Episcopal church? This book looks at the attractions of "crossing over".

On a more personal note, Chip Ingram in IAm With You Always: Experiencing God In Times of Need uses the Psalms to help us in our everyday struggles. The Psalms are full of ordinary people in desperate situations who learned to trust God for strength and guidance. He leads the reader to experience God as a watchful shepherd, a mighty fortress, and a loving creator.

Seven Seasons Of The Man In the Mirror by Patrick Morley provides guidance for each major phase of your life. This book is aimed at men and offers perspectives on the seven seasons of Reflection, Building, Crisis, Renewal, Rebuilding, Suffering, and Success. When the storms of life come unexpectedly the author wants readers to experience God's grace to be able to withstand any weather.

Finding Her Confidence

Melissa didn't know what to do. Her oldest daughter, Brianna, struggled with anger issues and Melissa felt she was losing control at home. She wanted to have a loving relationship with her daughter, and she was afraid of becoming the "stern parent."

She turned to LSI's Mental Health and Behavioral Health Intervention Services for help three years ago.

The services provide regular home visits and family meetings for Melissa and Brianna. Each week, Brianna's LSI team collaborates with her to find the coping skills she needs to thrive.

"We're trying positive reinforcement, we're practicing exercises like taking a pillow and screaming into it," Melissa says. "Instead of just yelling and screaming, we're finding an outlet for that anger." Brianna is also learning to express herself through her favorite hobby: drawing. Melissa says her daughter is a visual learner, so the family is using art to help Brianna cope with her anger. Brianna loves her drawing exercises so much that she now wants to become an artist when she grows up.

Every step of the way, Melissa says she has felt empowered and supported by her LSI team.

"You get the positive support. As parents, you hear that you're doing a good job. You get that pat on the back when you're feeling defeated," she says. "Without these programs, our family would still be struggling. LSI gives you the tools you need."

-Meeting called to order at 6:32 PM by President Lipes

Opening Prayer and Devotional:

- -Pastor opened with a prayer and we then discussed the bible verse, Matthew 18:20 "For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them"
- -We discussed what it means to gather in Jesus' name, times when we have felt Christ's presence in a group gathering and how the promise of Jesus is with us help and how we can share that news with others.
- -We then closed with a prayer.

Pastor's Report:

- -Pastor was busy this last month with visitations, classes, prayer group meetings, group studies, Conference 7 Pastor's Meeting, pre-marital counseling, a funeral, and confirmation
- -Confirmation class continues to go well and the class will be serving the 4th Sunday meal this month
- -Prayer of Peace Service was held on January 29th and approximately 20 people attended
- -Pulpit Supply is on February 26 with Pastor Chad going to St. Bernadette's and Reverend Kimberly Bowles of Springdale UMC coming to Bethany
- -Ash Wednesday is March 1 at Springdale UMC at 7:00 PM
- -Wednesday Lent Suppers and Worship will begin on March 8 with Supper at 6:15 PM and Worship at 7 PM

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> (Jamie Zimmerman in for Jon Twing)

- -Paula moved and Beth seconded that we accept the January 9, 2017 minutes. Motion passed.
- -Paula moved and Jill seconded that we accept the January 15, 2017 minutes as amended. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Jill Taylor)

- -Jill pointed out that Offering Revenue was approximately 5% less than the budgeted amount for the month of January, although we did due a good job of managing expenses as our total expenses for the month were less than revenue and almost 20% less than the monthly budgeted amount.
- -Jill mentioned that we had a negative \$31.50 balance in the Angel Tree fund and asked how we wanted to address it.

-Beth moved and Wayne seconded that we transfer \$31.50 from the General Fund to the Angel Tree Fund to eliminate the negative balance. Motion passed.

-Jamie moved and Paula seconded that we accept the Treasurer's Report. Motion passed.

Committee Reports:

- -Building and Grounds: (Jamie) I received an email today from our insurance provider stating our Property and Casualty insurance is going down 2% or \$114 per year on our March renewal. Dell Hughes and I cleaned out the storage shed and built storage racks for all the long tables and moved them out into the building. Candy and I are going to clean out and organize the furnace room sometime in the next couple of weeks.
- **-Education:** (Tonya) We are officially confirmed with EWALU to have them provide teachers for Bible School this year which will begin with their arrival on Sunday, June 11 and classes beginning on Monday, June 12. Tonya is checking to see if the Methodists are going to participate with us again this year. The $4^{th} 6^{th}$ Grade Wednesday night Sunday School class has 8-10 kids attending on a weekly basis and they will be doing the Wednesday, March 8 Lenten Supper and the April 23^{rd} 4^{th} Sunday Supper
- -Evangelism: (Wayne) No Report
- **-Fellowship:** (Paula) The Confirmation Class is doing the 4th Sunday Supper this month. We are dropping bingo from the 4th Sunday Supper as we haven't really had anyone showing up for it.

-Stewardship: (Jon) No Report

-Youth: (Cheryl) No Report

-Worship and Music: (Beth) Jill Barnhart is going to temporarily fill in until we can find a full time replacement for Seth. Jill would like to do it full time but can't once summer is here as Springdale UMC switches to a 9:30 service time which will conflict with our worship time. We have had 2 people inquire about the position, but we haven't heard back from them yet.

Old Business:

- Open Committee Assignments: Wayne agreed to assume Evangelism and Cheryl will be in charge of Youth.
- Capital Campaign for the Roof: Jamie gave a presentation on the bids we have and showed the council a sample of the roofing materials we will actually be installing. The bid on materials is a little high so we may save some money there on returned materials once the project is done. We checked on if it would save us any money on insurance premiums by having a metal roof and were told by our insurance agent it would not, although we are going to have an additional conversation with them as this doesn't seem correct. The committee has decided to use a campaign approach similar to what was done to raise funds for the parking lot and they are in the process of drafting a letter and pledge card that will be sent to all Council Members before it is mailed out to the Congregation. Should this approach not raise the necessary funds the committee will explore other options. The goal is to get the new roof installed no later than this summer as we still continue to have shingles being blown off the roof.
- SEIA Pig/Hunger Campaign: Jill gave us a short presentation after having explored this in more detail and felt we should pass on it based on all the other things we are doing in the community, in particular with the School Backpack Program.

New Business:

- Paula handed out the Council Binders to everyone and reviewed them with us.
- Greg brought up that Candy had mentioned we have more table cloths for the big wooden tables than we actually need and she feels we should sell or donate some of them. There was quite a bit of discussion on this and it was decided that when Jamie and Candy clean out the furnace room them will also go through the table cloths to determine exactly how many of which kinds we have and what we want to get rid of.

Meeting adjourned at 7:54 PM with the Lord's Prayer.

Easter Worship:

As the worship committee continues its search for a musician to guide us we have to face some challenges. As such, on Easter Sunday we will only have one worship service at 9:00 a.m. We anticipate a large crowd and therefore are seeking your help.

Hospitality will be of utmost importance on Easter Sunday. Each of us likes the comfort of our "traditional" seats; however, on this day the worship committee would invite everyone to please fill the front pews first. Also, we will need to squeeze in and really get close to our neighbor in order to maximize space. Doing so will allow us to free up the back pews for visitors and those arriving late. We don't want anyone to walk in and then walk out because they can't find a spot to sit. Also, we more than likely will need to utilize the pews in the choir loft and would urge those who are able to consider sitting there.

We do realize this might be a bit of an inconvenience; but, it is one Sunday and think of just how glorious it will be to have the worship space filled to capacity and the voices together sing out the good news of Easter morning. We might just be surprised!


