#### **Books For Adults**



I plan to put the Christmas books out on the display table. The author for the month is Wanda E. Brunstetter. Farmers' Market Mishap is the sequel to The Lopsided Christmas Cake that I featured two years ago. Living alone for the first time in her life is lonely for Elma Hochstetler, whose twin sister, Thelma, recently married. Though they share the running of a general store, more and more of Thelma's time is taken up by her growing family. Elma has dated some, but she wonders if she is just too picky to find love. Then a mishap happens at the farmers market and she meets someone that she instantly likes. But there are problems. Can they be overcome?

Brunstetter has written the quilt series that have been previously featured. The next book is titled *The Hawaiian Quilt* but it is not part of the series. In this book, Mandy Frey has

always wanted to see Hawaii. So before joining the Amish church and considering marriage to her boyfriend, she

convinces three friends to join her on a cruise to the Hawaiian Islands. She is captivated by the scenery and culture in Hawaii. A short vacation turns into an extended stay. Special friendships are made but home, family and boyfriend await Mandy back in Indiana. Will time away from the Amish community change Mandy's view of the world, her faith, and love? Where does a Hawaiian quilt fit into all of this?

Amish Cooking Class: The Seekers has the same type of story line as the Amish quilting series. Having been married for eight years with no children to help fill her day, Heidi Troyer cooks up the idea of teaching classes in the art of Amish cuisine. It is a recipe for drama when five very different men and women answer the advertisement. Charlene Higgins is engaged, but to the despair of her future husband's family, she can't cook. Kendra Perkins, a teen estranged from her family, is facing an unwanted pregnancy alone. Loretta Donnelly, widowed with two children, would like to simplify her life. Ron Hensley, a Vietnam Vet, parks his RV on the Troyer farm. And Eli Miller, an Amish widower, needs to learn how to cook for himself. Class members share details of their disappointing lives, work to solve a mystery, and stir some romance into the pot. Suddenly cooking classes at Heidi's house become life lessons.

In Amish Cooking Class: The Blessing we return to the Troyer farm where despite stressful changes occurring in their lives, Lyle and Heidi once again open up their Ohio home to those seeking to learn about Amish cooking. This time six unique adults sign up. Nicole Smith, is a teenager, helping her divorced dad cook for the family. Lisa Brooks, is a caterer, needing new recipes. Todd Collins, is a food critic, who is curious about the way Amish women cook. Bill Mason, is a member of a hunting club, who always gets stuck cooking for his buddies. Allie Garrett, is a police officer's wife, who is given the class as an unwanted gift. Lance Freeman, is a mailman, who smells the good food when he delivers a package to the door. More than recipes are exchanged, as friendships form, a romance blossoms, and hearts receive healing nourishment, including Heidi's own hurting heart.

**Pastor's devotion** centered around 1 Thess 5:16-18 and Rejoice Pray Give Thanks

As the council has been in ongoing discussions about where the Spirit may be leading us, Pastor led a devotion on a Bible passage that may help us daily as we move forward. Pastor expressed his own angst about perhaps moving forward without first spending time in prayer and discernment. As he said, perhaps we moved to try and find answers without first seeking God's wisdom and then listening for God. Moving forward, we need to assess who we are as people of Bethany and where it will lead us.

#### Pastor's Report:

In addition to regular duties and ministry efforts, Pastor Chad mentioned a couple things of note over the past month including:

- 1) A WBARC community prayer service set for Oct 29 but still in the planning stages. One definite plan is to not hold it in a church since the group feels it may turn off community members who are not comfortable in a church building
- 2) He felt his continuing education events this month were valuable but specifically the four-day Luther Seminary event on the Craft of Preaching

There were no minutes from the September meeting.

**Treasurer's report was approved.** Jill will report on the final roof expenses and fund balance next month but the bills have all been paid.

**Property & Grounds:** Jamie was gone but it was mentioned that the roof was complete including some repairs that were done while Robertson's had their equipment here. One was closing off an area (outside) to keep bats away. Also the door at the accessible entrance was repaired by Jamie.

**Education:** Tonya said that both the Wednesday and Sunday morning groups were going well. She said they will be talking about the Christmas program soon.

**Evangelism:** Wayne mentioned there will be a Veteran's dinner coming up in the Great Hall.

<u>Worship & Music</u>: On November 5, the 80+ year old members will be honored.

#### **Old Business:**

**Community Needs:** We were asked to keep thinking about community needs and about Pastor's devotion.

Elections at Bethany: Pastor contacted our insurance agent and was advised that it is customary for the city or county's policy to be primary should a public election ever be held on Bethany's premises. We would simply be added to their policy as an additional insured and be provided a certificate of proof of insurance. An elections representative thinks it would be the county's responsibility. The county has future elections set up in advance so it would be a while before they would need to use Bethany as an election site.

#### **New Business:**

We need to get audit and budget committees set up. Jill will call budget committee members to help again this year

### GREAT HALL CROSS

Have you ever wondered about our cross in the Great Hall? Here is some information provided recently by Betty Slach.

The cross was donated in memory of Betty's husband Kenny and other Bethany Lutheran members we have come to know, honor and love as fellow Christians who have died in the faith.

The cross is actually two crosses joined together at their hearts. The larger background cross is made of oiled walnut. Its deep rich color and textured surface is to remind us of the "old rugged cross". This traditional cross is the one many of us, as well as our fore fathers, recognized as being the cross upon which our faith is based.

Super imposed on the traditional cross comes the cross of the future. It is constructed from light birch wood. This wood was shaped to resemble a beam of light radiating from a pinpoint source as its center. The Source of Light, of course, represents Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.



## Winter Break Service Trip to Gulf Coast January 6-13, 2018

Gloria Dei and Zion Lutheran Churches in Iowa City are co-sponsoring a Winter Break service trip to the Gulf Coast to help those affected by recent disasters. The trip will be the week of January 6-13, 2018 – the final full week of winter break before University of Iowa classes resume.

Transportation cost for non-students is \$200/person. (Financial assistance for others is available for those who find that cost prohibitive). \$200 scholarships to cover the transportation costs are available to all students. We are hoping to keep additional costs to a minimum by staying in church basements or tent cities for volunteers. Participants are responsible for meal costs, which we will seek to keep minimal.

(For those who are interested, we can also assist you in arranging alternative housing accommodations at your own cost).

## ANNUAL MEETING

Bethany's annual meeting will be held January 21, 2018. Please plan to attend as your presence is vital and very much appreciated. This past summer the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gathered for its National Conference held every three years. As a result of that meeting several changes were made to the Model Constitution used by most congregations. These are mandatory changes and a copy of these changes will be made available at least 30 days prior to our annual meeting.

Also, this is a reminder of who is a voting member, according to our Constitution. All others are welcome to attend; however, they just cannot vote.

**C8.02.c** *Voting* members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of the congregation.

### THE MASTER IS HERE AND CALLETH THEE

Have you ever wondered about that sign high above our worship space? Here is some information on that provided by Paul Friis.

Entering the Nave of Bethany Lutheran Church, the eye beholds the beautiful woodwork that is part of the archway to the alter. The wood archway contains the words, "The Master is Here and Calleth Thee."

It sets the tone for people in preparation for worship. It is a reminder for us why we come to church. Our Master wants us to be here to hear his word.

The early days of Bethany, this same sign was painted in the archway. During the remodeling of Bethany in 1974, the interior was painted and the sign was painted over.

In 1980, a new wooden arch was built for Bethany in memory of Homer Wiskes by his sister Mrs. Melvin Mickelson. The Mickelson's also gave the money for the restoration of the four corners of the church interior.

The archway was dedicated November 30<sup>th</sup>, 1980. Mark Scharnweber of Wood Benders did the work. There have been times when the calling of other churches brings us to thinking they might have better and more interesting worship service and other church activities.


