

Books for Adults

This month's author is Francine Rivers. She was an established writer of romance novels when she changed to fiction with a Christian theme. *Redeeming Love* was her first and classic book. It is the retelling of the Old Testament story of Hosea and Gomer amid the 1850's California gold rush. It is a powerful story of God's unconditional, redemptive love.

Her Mother's Hope takes place from the early 1900's to the 1950's. Marta Schneider, after leaving her native Switzerland, dreamed of owning a boarding house. Marriage and motherhood changed her ambitions. Determined to give her family a better life, she vows to raise

strong children. Her tough love, however, is often misunderstood, especially by her eldest daughter. It is a story about family and faith, dreams and disappointments, and shows the depths of grace and forgiveness. It shows the love between mother and daughter.

Her Daughter's Dream is the sequel and conclusion to the Marta's Legacy series. Marta's grand-daughter, Carolyn, comes of age in the turbulent 1960's. She develops a bond with her grandmother rather than her own mother. She struggles to avoid the mistakes of those who went before her and to become a bridge between the women in her family. It is a saga about the silent sorrows that can tear a family apart, the sacrifices mothers make for their daughters, and the very nature of unconditional love.

Additional books that we have in our library by Francine Rivers includes: *The Scarlet Thread, And the Shofar Blew,* and *Leota's Garden.* We have the book *A Lineage Of Grace,* "five stories of unlikely women who changed eternity". Included are Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, Bathsheba, and Mary. We also have *Sons Of Encouragement* about important men in the Bible. I have not seen this last book for awhile, so if you have it, please return it when finished.

Books For Children

The Spark Bible Story series sparks faith in the lives of young children and families. Using kid-friendly language, colorful artwork, and vivid storytelling, these books take readers on a journey through God's Word. For ages 3-8 we have *The Story Of Moses And God's Promise, The Story of Jesus' Teaching And Healing, The Story of Creation*, and *The Story Of Noah's Ark*. Holy Moly picture books encourage creativity and wonder in children as they color their way through beloved Bible stories. For ages 5-8 we have *Jesus Feeds 5,000, The Good Samaritan, Mary And Martha*, and *Saul Meets Jesus*.

MISSION AND OUTREACH

Quarter Tube

Our quarter tube has been around for quite some time and helped support many wonderful ministries. When the tube is completely full of quarters there is approximately \$135. Presently, the quarters are going to support the Operation Backpack program at Hoover Elementary. This program sends bags of food home with 20 students each weekend to ensure they have something to eat over the weekend. This program costs just under \$4,000 to fund annually. All food products are bought on a reduced rate from Hawkeye Area Community Action Program (HACAP) in Hiawatha. Presently, we need approximately \$1,600 by the end of the year so every quarter in the tube really will make a difference. West Branch Area Religious Council (WBARC) has donated \$1,500 already and Bethany also donated \$555.25 from our "God's work. Our Hands." Sunday car wash last fall. Please keep those quarters coming and thanks to all who have helped in the past.

Building Brighter Futures

Learning new things can always be difficult. Especially when you're learning to be a first-time parent. Sarah's first son, Mark, was a happy baby. But as he grew into his toddler years, Sarah was unsure how to handle his behavioral changes. When he started acting out at home, she felt herself growing more frustrated. Sarah knew she needed help. That's when she turned to LSI's Parents as Teachers program.

Parents as Teachers provides free and voluntary parent education and support for families in Boone and Story County, with children up to age 5. The program was with Sarah every step of the way, providing home visits, introducing her to community support groups, and teaching her how to adjust to Mark's developmental stages. "With help from Parents as Teachers, I learned his behavior was just a phase, and they told me it was normal," Sarah says. "Before, I thought there was a problem with me, or that I wasn't a good parent."

Mark, now 3, entered preschool last fall, and Sarah is proud to see how much progress he has made. He's meeting new friends and at home, he's become the best big brother to his baby sister, Hannah. Learning how to handle Mark's developmental stages has made Sarah more confident in raising Hannah. She knows what to expect as Hannah grows up, and she's ready to face each day and create the brightest future for her children. "Parents as Teachers helped me so much with my parenting," Sarah says. "The program is the best thing I have."

For some time there has been discussion about finding space in our Nave (i.e., where the congregation worships) for those who might be in a wheel chair or simply need more space than a pew can provide. The thought process was of trying to incorporate them better into our worship space and make them feel a part of the worshipping assembly. After pondering possible ideas it was suggested we remove the back pew on the lectern side. This opens up that space allowing a wheel chair and/or chairs to be set up. That pew was placed along the back wall for the Ministers of Hospitality (i.e., greeters) to sit or anyone else that may benefit from having more leg room. This article is an effort to communicate the thought process and reasoning for trying this. The pew can always be moved back if we decide this option does not work for us.

-Meeting called to order at 6:32 PM by President Black

Opening Prayer and Devotional:

- -Pastor opened with a reading from 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (NLT) and we then discussed the following 3 questions:
- 1. When do you find it difficult to follow Paul's advice to give thanks in all circumstances?
- 2. When you consider our work together, for what are you most thankful to God?
- 3. How does saying thanks in all circumstances affect one's life?
- -After discussion, Pastor closed with a prayer.

Pastor's Report:

- -Pastor was very busy this last month with a large number of visitations, classes, prayer group meetings, group studies, and the holidays.
- -Pulpit Supply date is tentatively set for Sunday, Feb 26 with rotation yet to be determined.
- -Christmas Eve services were well attended.
- -We received a card of thanks from the Food Pantry for our ongoing help and donations. Neil and Chris continue to do a great job coordinating this program for us.
- -The Angel Tree was an outstanding success again and Jeni as always, did a great job with this and put in a lot of hard work to make this happen again. Jeni estimated we received roughly \$1,000 in cash and close to \$2,000 in gifts this year.
- -February 21 is Lutheran Day on the Hill where members of state-wide Lutheran Congregations are able to meet with our state legislators and Pastor encouraged any members who want to go to please do so as it is a very nice day.

Secretary's Report: (Jon Twing)

-Jill moved to accept the minutes with some corrections and additions. Beth seconded. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Jill Taylor)

- -Jill explained that our income fell short for the year by roughly \$4,800 based on the income projections that were put together for the 2016 budget year. This is roughly 3%.
- -Jill also explained that we over-paid Pastor approximately \$1,893 this last year. This was not due to an error on anyone's part but rather to an increase from 2015 to 2016 in the amount which is deducted from Pastor's

salary for Pre-tax deductions for FSA/Health Care, Pension and Retirement Benefits, and Supplemental Term Life Insurance. The increase from 2015 to 2016 on these deductions was not communicated to us which resulted in 2015 deduction amounts and calculations being used which resulted in the over-payment in cash compensation to Pastor. Beth moved and Kevin seconded that we accept the Treasurer's Report and nothing be done on the over-payment to Pastor as no one was aware of this nor was Pastor. Motion passed unanimously.

Committee Reports:

- -Building and Grounds: (Jamie Zimmerman) We purchased 5 6ft plastic tables for the great hall to replace the 3 heavy wooden tables that the Quilters and classes had been using for a total of approximately \$264. We gathered more cost and warranty information on new steel shingles vs asphalt or rubberized shingles which will be presented at the Congregational Meeting. It appears that from a cost and warranty standpoint, that steel will be the best way to go.
- **-Education:** (Tonya Samuelson) The $4^{th} 6^{th}$ Grade Wednesday Sunday School class is going to be hosting the April, Fourth Sunday Supper and the March 8^{th} Lent Wednesday Supper.
- -Evangelism: (Greg Lipes) No Report.
- **-Fellowship:** (Paula Casper) Candy is doing the 4th Sunday Supper this month.
- -Youth: (Kevin Olson) No Report.
- -Worship and Music: (Beth Kaufman) Seth just today gave us his 30 day notice of his intent to resign as accompanist. Our committee will begin work shortly on finding a replacement.

Old Business:

-We briefly reviewed the Annual Report and 2017 Budget to see if anyone had any additional questions.

New Business:

-President Black reminded everyone that the annual meeting is this coming Sunday, January 15.
-Jamie moved, and Greg seconded that we transfer \$10,000 from the General Fund to the Mission Investment Fund. Motion passed.

Meeting adjourned at 8:20 PM with the Lord's Prayer.

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As the acting Treasurer of the West Branch Area Religious Council (WBARC) I want to once again thank all of you for your faithful partnership and support of our shared ministry together. Through your faithful stewardship and monetary donations to our joint account we were able to continue our shared mission in assisting those in need in our community.

During 2016 WBARC received \$932 in monetary gifts. Thank you all so much! We had mission expenditures of \$2,195.86. All of these expenditures went directly to financial assistance except a minimal amount (\$42.25) going to cover costs for Baccalaureate. Thankfully, we had an abundance of monetary gifts in reserve; however, to continue our ongoing support of assisting those in need in our community and also the backpack program (i.e., weekend food program) through Hoover Elementary we will need additional gifts during the upcoming year and ask each congregation to pray about this and our ongoing partnership together.

During 2016 we assisted approximately 13 individuals and/or families with needs such as a room at the Presidential Inn, food vouchers to Jack and Jill, fuel assistance, utility and rental assistance, and a few other needs. In several of these instances we worked in partnership with Police Chief Horihan and/or West Branch School representatives as specific needs arose. Additionally, WBARC continued its strong support of the Weekend Backpack Program by allocating \$1,500 to fund this valuable ministry and hopefully we will be able to continue with this same amount in 2017 as that program costs around \$2500 - \$3000 annually. For those who don't know, this program is coordinated by the West Branch School District and currently sends home a backpack full of food each Friday to approximately 15 students. It is an invaluable ministry in our community.

Once again, on behalf of my colleagues, let me express our gratitude and thankfulness for your commitment and faithfulness to our shared ministry. We do our best to faithfully steward these gifts and see they are making a difference and extending God's care and love to all. We look forward to 2017, our partnership together, and our joint efforts in doing God's work in our community.
