#### MOBILE FOOD PANTRY



#### It Takes a Village

When Fan's first child, Rain, was born, she was determined to raise him to be gentle, patient, and independent. But as he entered his crawling, walking, and climbing phases, things began to change. Originally from China, Fan was not well connected in her community. When Rain became a very mobile and curious toddler, she had no other parents to talk with about how to handle his latest developmental stages.

Fan turned to LSI's People Place, a family and community resource center in Ames. The program provides parents with access to low-cost or free parenting classes, support groups, and home visitations. For low-income families like Fan's, People Place is a life-changing resource.

Now Rain can play with other children his age at People Place, and Fan has a chance to meet more parents with similar life experiences.

"They've helped me a lot by answering my concerns when he's growing or developing a problem," Fan says. "Someone else there might be having the same problem, so you can connect with them. It's a lot more fun to learn in a group how to raise your kids instead of doing it alone."

# CHURCH ROOF UPDATE

On behalf of the Building and Grounds Committee and the Church Council, we would like to thank everyone who has donated to our roof fundraising campaign. While we have nearly reached our goal, we are still \$2-3,000 short of where we would like to be as an ending number. The campaign goal has increased by about \$1,000 from what was discussed at the Congregational Meeting in January, due to our planning to do a minor repair job in the Sanctuary attic that was not previously identified. This repair will further reinforce the Sanctuary roof and was recommended by the Structural Engineers who supervised the original roof work back in 1999. While it isn't necessary that these repairs be done prior to the new roof being installed, we thought we would go ahead and do them while we have members who are physically capable of doing the work. Should you have questions about these repairs, please talk to Del Hughes, John Black, or Jamie Zimmerman. If you wish to assist with the work, please see one of these individuals.

#### BETHANY LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES—MARCH 2017

Members Present: Greg Lipes, Jill Taylor, Paula Casper, Beth Kaufman, Wayne Frauenholtz, Jamie Zimmerman, Jon Twing, Cheryl Fischer

Members Absent: Tonya Samuelson, Pastor Chad

#### **Opening Prayer and Devotional** (President Lipes)

President Lipes opened commenting that Pastor Chad was still recovering from surgery. Greg commented that the Pastor is feeling better, the surgery was a success but he is still sore and not yet sleeping well.

President Lipes led the devotional by reading a story he called "The Barber's Prayer" that was written by Martin Luther entitled "Simple Way to Pray"

#### **Pastor's Report** (President Lipes)

19 Pastoral visits

Good service was held on Ash Wednesday and it was well attended

Pulpit Exchange went well

WBARC: Began discussions about Baccalaureate and whether or not to continue this year as attendance has been declining—with the overall impression that it would continue; A mobile food pantry is coming to town on March 21<sup>st</sup> and this will be new to our community—more information is posted in the Hope Chest and near the stairs

Wednesday Lenten services are planned Paula Casper on March 8<sup>th</sup> and Mike Fryauf on March 15<sup>th</sup> given that the Pastor is out recovering from surgery.

Thursday night Prayer Group is going well though only two were in attendance last week. Discussion included a daily prayer call "The Examen" which was captured by St. Ignatius

Small Group discussions on February 16<sup>th</sup> were well attended.

#### **Secretary's Report:** (Jon Twing)

Editorial corrections made by Jon Twing; Authorship edits made by Jon Twing;

Beth Kaufman moved to accept, second by Jamie Zimmerman. Minutes accepted as corrected

#### **Treasurer's Report:** (Jill Taylor)

Jill commented that the Mission and Investment Fund accounts are still pending movement on the financial report Jill explained the account labeled as "Pass Through"...for things like Easter flowers

Jill reported that money for the Synod Dinner came late and was added to the 2017 books to offset costs in 2016 (\$500 total)

Council discussed the Bank/Vanco service fees (electronic gifting) and their raising cost as a concern. Council was in consensus that these services was desired and needed. It was also pointed out that this service provider was not sponsored by the Synod. It was generally agreed upon that Jill should monitor these costs.

Paula Casper moved to accept, second by Jon Twing, report accepted

#### **Committee Reports:**

#### **Building and Grounds** (Jamie Zimmerman)

Candy and Jamie cleaned and organized the storage rooms next to the Great Hall. Some old items were recycled and things of value were kept

Jamie and Linda Black performed spring tree trimmings on the grounds of the Church and Parsonage

Jamie reported that he had discussions with the Robertson's (the potential roofer of the Church) about costs and materials. Jamie also reported that he had discussions with the Insurance provider regarding reduced costs once the metal roof is added.

**Education** (Tonya Samuelsson as provided by Paula Casper)

The Methodist Church is keen to do a joint Vocation Bible School again this year

Discussion about possible joint Youth Group activities also transpired and deferred to the next WBARC meeting

#### **Evangelism** (Wayne Frauenholtz)

Wayne provided no written report but commented on the value of the "Baptism Sermon" Pastor Hougen provided last Sunday and how it captured the spirit of our Evangelism mission

#### **Fellowship** (Paula Casper)

Council will provide the Lenten Supper on Wednesday, March 15

A potluck soup supper is planned for Wednesday, March 29<sup>th</sup> and volunteers are requested

Paula will host the Fourth Sunday Supper on March 26<sup>th</sup> and is looking for help

#### **Stewardship** (Jon Twing)

Jon provided no written report but commented that he and Pastor discussed the need to convene a Stewardship Committee meeting and take action before summer. Jon commented that the ball was definitely in his court.

### Youth (Cheryl Fischer)

Actions are pending

No Palm Sunday meal is anticipated

#### Worship & Music (Beth Kaufman)

Beth presented a dilemma for Easter Sunday because Jill Barnhart needs to attend the Springdale Service on Easter morning. The Committee recommended that we provide only one Easter morning service starting at 9:00 a.m. If so, Jill can perform and perhaps the Choir can sing. The Committee also recommends that two sets of Greeters be used (one to greet and one to usher) such that we do not waste space in the pews. Council discussed and supported these recommendations. Jamie commented that we could set up extra chairs. Beth commented that we could also use the Choir space if needed.

Beth stated that she is chasing down two interested parties from the University of Iowa who may be interested in the open pianist/organist position.

Beth also noted that we have an issue this summer with Jill, as she will want to attend the Springdale services. The committee's recommendation is that Bethany change our summer services to an 8:00 a.m. start to accommodate. The Council was in support of this but noted it needed to be evangelized with the congregation first.

#### **Old Business (All)**

Jamie updated the Council on the Capital Campaign. Jamie started by saying that 10% of the Capital Campaign goal of \$27,500 was already received.

Jamie also updated us about the insurance—with a

new metal roof, our annual rates will fall by an additional \$200 or a change in deductible from \$5,000 to \$2,500. Jill Taylor moved we accept the reduced premium, as second by Cheryl Fischer and was approved.

Jamie proposed that we send a letter and pledge card by mail for the Capital Campaign. The council reviewed and approved the letter with one amendment (i.e., who to contact with any questions). The council discussed the pledge card and made changes and edits. Jamie will work with Paula to get these mailed ASAP with a return date of March 26 suggested.

#### **New Business (All)**

Jamie volunteered to work on attempting to get our existing microphones and supporting equipment working such that any large gatherings in the Great Hall can be amplified

The Council reviewed the pile of extra table cloths and chose which to keep and which to discard

Jamie reported that the Kids for Hunger Mission has changed hands with new owners who want additional funds for supporting this effort. The Council was in agreement that no additional funds are to be provided. Council discussed merits of various options to continue with more investigation by Jamie required and a decision pending in the future.

A request was made from a member of the Congregation to reinstate the "Noisy Can Coin Collection".

Jon Twing commented that this would seem to be a Stewardship function and the Council agreed.

As such, it was agreed upon that the "Noisy Can Coin Collection" would be reoccurring on the last day of each month with the proceeds distributed at the pleasure of the Pastor.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:03
