Dear Faithful Ministers of Christ,

I want to take a moment and thank each of you for all you do to further God's kingdom here at Bethany and beyond through our various activities, mission efforts, and God's work each of you do in your daily lives. God continues to provide for Christ's church

through the generous, supporting, and loving hands of the faithful people of God. So thank God. Thank God for God's faithfulness and thank God for each of you – your time, your talents, and your financial contributions to the church and to other causes which support God's mission in the world.

This brings us back around to stewardship. Yes, it's fall so we must talk about stewardship. However, stewardship shouldn't be talked about once a year. It is something we are called to attend to daily. God called us to be stewards – that is caretakers of all God created and entrusted to us. This year the stewardship committee is trying a new approach and I urge each of you to look for additional information forthcoming on this. There will not be a fall campaign as has been traditionally done in the past; but, rather a year-long emphasis on stewardship which will manifest itself in various ways. This is something new and we trust the Spirit's hand is in it. Perhaps, we need to be jarred a bit every once in a while in order to grow and experience the fullness of God's grace. Perhaps, we need to be coaxed out of familiarity and into unchartered waters in an effort to put our full trust in Jesus Christ to guide the way through to smoother sailing.

We often squirm a bit when we talk about stewardship. It wasn't that long ago I, too, sat in the pews and got a bit uncomfortable when my pastor started to talk about money or time or talents. That's personal stuff. Yet, Jesus didn't shy away from talking about it. In fact, he talked about money nearly as much as he talked about the kingdom of God. So why? What was Jesus getting at? He talked about money because of his great love for God's people. He talked about money because as Mark Allan Powell writes, "He cared about us and because he knew that what we do with our money affects who we are spiritually." (Giving to God; William B. Eerdmans Publishing Company, 2006 p. 54). Powell contends the biblical witness testifies that stewardship is a spiritual discipline. That is, it is a practice we can do to regularly maintain our spiritual health just as practices such as prayer, attending worship, reading the Bible, etc. In the verse above Jesus says our treasure, which certainly includes our money but also whatever else we value such as our time, families, bodies, and possessions, and what we do with our treasurers affects our hearts. As Powell writes, "it determines who we are inside. It determines what sort of people we become."

While we won't have a fall campaign, let each of us ponder these words of Jesus. Again, thank you faithful people of God! May the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus! — Pastor Chad


- Thursday, November 10
