Dear Faithful Followers of Christ Jesus our Lord,

Grace and peace to each of you! I have been spending a great

deal of time in reflection as of late. I suppose the death of a close loved one (in my case, my brother) has a way of doing that. That is, I have found it to be true a death or an illness or some other struggle we experience has a way of forcing us to reflect about what we are currently experiencing, feeling, and possibly even where we are at presently in our life. This is all part of the grief pro-

cess we go through. It is a perfectly natural human response to pain. Those moments of waiting, longing, and reflecting are indeed painful and full of heartache at times and may seem like they will never end; however, they also can be very fruitful and productive ultimately helping bring us out of the darkness and into the glorious Light that continues to shine through the darkness.

One of the things I have reflected upon is the fact I am who I am. In many ways since beginning my call to ordained ministry I have allowed myself to change. Don't get me wrong – change often is exactly what is needed and can indeed be a good and healthy thing leading to growth and transformation. However, at other times changes we make may actually work against us and exhaust us spiritually, mentally, and even physically. Therefore, with God's help I am going to try and simply be who I am – who God has called me to be – trusting that it is good enough. A much wiser colleague than I gave me this bit of advice and I am grateful for it.

Ultimately, all of us truly need to be who we are and trust that is good enough and God is able to use us just as God created us. We aren't perfect nor do we have to be. We are sinners but at the same time we are saints because we are clothed in our baptisms with the garment of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. When we fail to be true to ourselves then inherently we fail to be true to who God created us to be and fall prey to the trap of living up to everyone else's (and even our own) expectations rather than to God's. So be who you are! Be who God created you to be with the unique gifts, talents, and abilities God has equipped you with!


