

We will explore the following themes during our worship services in October:

October 27 – Found faithful with all. In this final emphasis Sunday, time and talent sheets will be made available and we will turn in our pledge cards. We acknowledge that all we have has been entrusted to us by God and we are called to be wise, generous stewards of the time, talents, and money and material goods that we have.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES August 12, 2013

Meeting Called to Order: 6:30 p.m. by President Del Hughes

Opening Prayer/Devotions: Pastor Chad led a devotion on Psalm 30 and Bonnie Conner gave the prayer.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Chad reported on his activities for the month. One of the highlights was participating in the Vacation Bible School program, which was in addition to normal activities and a family vacation.

Secretary's Report: Minutes from the July regular meeting to be approved: Kent Kaufman moved to accept the minutes. Claudia Beyer seconded. Approved.

Treasurer's Report: Claudia presented the July financials. Candy Madsen moved to accept the Treasurer's Report. Courtney Heid seconded. Approved.

Committee Reports:

Building & Grounds: Kent reported that he worked on the vacuum cleaner, fixed a plugged toilet and has been working on the parking lot and retaining wall issues. Also, the furnace motor has been replaced.

Education: Courtney and Toni reported that VBS was awesome. The EWALU counselors were very energetic and great to work with and we will plan to have them back next summer. They also reported that \$805 in donations were received to offset the cost of \$52/camper, \$200 in advertising, and \$400 in additional expenses. Sunday School will be starting on September 15 and they are currently looking for teachers.

Youth: EPIC, energetic peeps in Christ, entered a float in the Hoover Hometown Days parade, delivered chemo bags to the Mercy Cancer Unit, raised approximately \$300 for the Malaria fund with their lemonade stand, and are hosting a swimming pool party at the West Liberty pool on Sunday evening, August 18. They are also planning a fun trip to Adventureland in September.

Evangelism & Missions: no report.

Music and Worship: Bonnie reported that she received good feedback on the service that took place downstairs the weekend after the VBS program. She has been looking into getting instrumental music for special music at some of the worship services.

Fellowship: Candy is taking a different approach to the Sunday morning fellowship time and is asking folks to help stock the cupboards with cookies and crackers for simple snacks to serve on Sunday mornings. She would also like to work with the Stewardship committee and Education committee on some food/meal planning.

Stewardship: Nancy reported that the Stewardship committee has the bulletin board up and going with plans to highlight various ministries during the year and promote volunteer opportunities as they come up. The group is working on the next quarterly newsletter and the upcoming fall campaign, "Found Faithful, in Little, with Much, with All".

OLD BUSINESS:

- Gods Work Our Hands Sunday Del and Candy will contact the city to see if there is a project we can undertake downtown, such as cleaning town hall.
- Hoover Hometown Days popcorn stand was run by Del again this year and made a profit of about \$200.
- Kent reported that the preliminary parking lot expansion proposal has passed the zoning committee and city council and will be presented to the congregation at a special meeting. The rough estimate is \$25,000 to \$27,000 for 15 additional paved spots.
- Kent also reported that upon further review of property lines
 the railroad tie section of the retaining wall between the parsonage and neighbor is actually on the neighbor's property. He
 has been in contact with the neighbor regarding this.
- Kent also noted that the abstract for the church property has been corrected and is now up-to-date, thanks to John Black.

NEW BUSINESS:

 The sound system in the great hall is not working. Pastor Chad has received a bid, which will be reviewed at the September council meeting.
