Dear Faithful Saints.

500 years ago things changed dramatically as a little known German monk, priest, and professor nailed a list of 95 concerns he had with the teachings of the church of his day to the doors of the Castle church in Wittenberg. This would be the fuel that sparked what we call the

Reformation. It is important to note the Roman Catholic church of Luther's day is not the Roman Catholic church of today and that in recent years Lutherans and Catholics have come together in agreement on many theological and doctrinal issues.

The passage above from Romans and the entire book itself really opened Luther up to a completely new understanding of God and God's grace. Prior to this discernment by the Holy Spirit Luther writes:

"Although I was living an irreproachable life as a monk, I felt that I was a sinner before God with an extremely distressed conscience. I could not have confidence that it could find peace through my performance of satisfactions. I did not love – I hated! – the righteous God who punished sinners. Secretly, I expressed anger with God, if not in the form of blasphemy, at least with intense grumbling. (*By Heart Conversations With Martin Luther's Small Catechism*; Augsburg Fortress, 2017; p. 9)

Following his revelation of the goodness and grace of a loving God from his study of Romans, he writes:

"At this point I felt that I had been completely born again and had entered paradise itself through wide open doors. There a completely different face of the entire Scripture appeared to me." (*By Heart*; p. 9)

Five-Hundred years later this amazing grace of God is what continues to drive the church forward. The gospel of Jesus Christ, his life, death, and resurrection, is the lifeblood of our entire beings that fills us and truly gives us new life each and everyday. In these words Luther found freedom. Rather than seeing a God of judgement he found a God of salvation. Rather than living in fear of God as a judge he found a God of love in Jesus Christ. Rather than seeing righteousness as something he could never strive to attain he saw it as a gift, pure and unconditional, flowing from God. Grace upon grace and he wanted the world to know about it and live into that same inexplicable joy his heart had been filled with. This is truly what we continue to celebrate 500 years later.



I will mention once again the book *Papa Luther: A Graphic Novel* by Daniel D. Maurer. *Papa Luther* tells the story of Martin Luther and the Reformation as seen through the eyes of his children. It is for children ages 8 to 12 but it is also suitable for older children.

DVD

We have a copy of *Rick Steve's Luther And The Reformation*. This is a one hour public television special commemorating the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. Filmed on location in Germany and Rome, Rick Steves traces the dramatic events of this movement that changed the course of history. I think that it is important that he provides the context for the reformation and provides the roots of the religious discontent that led up to this moment, including the messy politics of the 16th century. Bonus features on this DVD include: *Germany's Luther Towns* which are from his public television series. Also included are one hour specials on *Rick Steves' European Christmas* and *Rick Steves' European Easter*.


REFORMATION 500

Healing through Harmony

Jaden's life changed when he was 5 years old. His father unexpectedly passed away, and through his grief, Jaden's connection to his mother became strained and he struggled to manage his anger at home. He was placed in LSI's Beloit Residential Treatment Center in Ames when he was 10, and he remembers being introduced to Spiritual Life.

The voluntary LSI program connects youth in residential treatment with faith-based art, music, and film. It is there to serve as a safe space for children to open up about their emotions and get the support they need to thrive.

"I always knew I loved to sing and I liked music," Jaden says. "Songs made me feel better, and music allowed me to express myself." Jaden eventually relocated to LSI's Bremwood Residential Treatment Center in Waverly, where he reconnected with Pastor Dennis Bauer, the director of the Spiritual Life program. "Jaden is one of the few kids who would actively set up lunch appointments with me," Pastor Dennis says. "He's really benefitted from being able to talk during the day." Having access to a support network and a trusting relationship with Pastor Dennis has helped Jaden feel empowered to make a positive change during his time at Bremwood.

Now 14, Jaden's finding his faith through music, and he's learning how to talk about his trauma and become a role model for other lowa children in residential treatment. Jaden has now been adopted into a loving family. As he finishes up his treatment at Bremwood, his family is there to visit and worship with him, and Jaden is enjoying being a new big brother in his family.



August 14, 2017 Council Minutes

Meeting called to order at 6:36 p.m. by President Lipes

Members Present: Greg Lipes, Jill Taylor, Paula Casper, Beth Kaufman, Jamie Zimmerman, Jon Twing, Pastor Chad, Cheryl Fischer

Members Absent: Wayne Frauenholtz, Tonya Samuelson

Opening Prayer and Devotional (Pastor Chad)

Pastor Chad led a devotional asking "why are we here"? We are here because Jesus loves us and we should embrace, celebrate and proclaim this with joy.

Pastor's Report (Pastor Chad)

See report as submitted

Pastor Chad commented that "Music Sunday" was a big hit and a good respite for the summer service. Pastor Chad commented that his is thankful for the vacation time and glad to be back refreshed and recharged.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> (Jamie Zimmerman for Jon Twing)

Jamie distributed the June/July minutes and accepted one correction.

Jill Taylor moved to accept, second was by Paula Casper. Minutes accepted with corrections.

Treasurer's Report: (Jill Taylor)

Jill Taylor provided the June and July reports. Some clarification discussion but no action was required. Paula Casper moved to accept, second was by Jamie Zimmerman. Report was approved.

Committee Reports:

Building and Grounds (Jamie Zimmerman)

Jamie Zimmerman reported that roofing project was expected to start in the next two to three weeks. All materials have been purchased and the contractors were scheduling the job.

Jamie Zimmerman updated the Council on the purchase of a new wireless microphone for use in the Great Hall. This was discussed previously (i.e., after last year's Annual Meeting), as with large groups it is hard to be heard.

Jamie is catching up on the landscaping but is happy for members to join in when they want and if they see some gardening/landscaping that is needed. Education (Pastor Chad for Tonya Samuelsson)
Rally Sunday is scheduled for September 17th.
Per usual, we will have a potluck fellowship following.
Postcards will be going out shortly. More teachers are needed—particularly for grades PS-3. If anyone is interested and/or knows of someone who might be interested, please see Tonya.

Evangelism (Wayne Frauenholtz) No report submitted

Fellowship (Paula Casper)

Paula reported that support for the Fourth Sunday supper is waning and that if we want to keep up this service we need to find help organizing it and running it.

Paula also updated the Council on plans for "Uganda Thunder" Concert coming to Bethany on September 11 (Monday). More support is needed. One more host home is desired. An evening meal is needed (Chicken, rice and vegetables). Help with activities at the concert is also needed (ushers, parking lot attendants, refreshments, etc.). Please see Paula if you can help. Bethany is also providing breakfast and a sack lunch the next morning; help with this function is also needed). There will be a store at the concert to purchase merchandise and a love offering will be made. All the proceeds go to local Uganda charities.

Stewardship (Jon Twing)

No report

Youth (Cheryl Fischer)

Cheryl discussed the feedback on the youth surveys mailed. The Youth Group is exploring monthly or bimonthly activities "on demand" to exploit opportunity and schedule.

Worship & Music (Beth Kaufman)

Beth reported that the Worship and Music committee have been very busy working on:

New Acolyte robes, Outdoor Service, Rally Sunday Senior Appreciation day (First Sunday in November) Choir Training

We discussed extensively the Christmas Eve services this year since Christmas falls on a Sunday. The Worship and Music Committee will explore options and report back.

Old Business (All)

Greg led discussion regarding the Community needs project and followed up with the discussion by providing minutes of what was discussed (redacted for confidentiality):

Provide rides to Iowa City for folks with limited transportation means., Support for Families, Inc.; They have lost a lot of funding. They have 1-2 people per week (in West Branch) who need their services, but cannot afford them. Not covered by most health insurance. \$1,000 gives 1 family service for 3 months (counseling in the home).

How to get kids involved in the Church and the community?

Prayer at the pole event (tried before successfully)? Get a praise band to come to West Branch/Host a Summer Camp (like Grinnell)

Suggests that the mistake we often make is to contact parents and try to "force" kids to participate. Instead, suggests we provide financial support and let the kids lead such an effort.

On a similar theme, it was suggested that kids don't have anything to do in the summer. What can we provide?

We have families in emergency in our community (i.e.: about to have their power turned off). Would like to have access to an emergency fund to help these folks. Jamie suggested that he at least ask Bethany about helping before turning folks away.

Can we "up the ante" with the food pantry, perhaps using Tipton as a model to strive towards (i.e., fresh produce, refrigeration, coupons for discounted purchases, etc.)?

Hunger was identified as a big problem in our community

Community Garden? Open to all, but target kids who qualify for free/reduced lunch program, backpack program; Get kids to help in garden. Teach kids every aspect of running a garden (starting seeds, planting, weeding, harvesting). Teach kids how to use the food/cook with food. There is at least one member of the community who is passionate and would love to support. Mayor Laughlin is very excited about this project and is willing to push for it—the City may donate land to this project.

The Library needs various help--maintaining the exterior of the building (pruning, weeding, etc.); various volunteering needs; could use homemade cookies for children's' programs.

New Business (All)

God's Work, Our Hands Sunday is coming. Dutch and Dea need help with their basement as they have much water damage. This would involve cutting and hauling drywall away. We could also target the Library (see community needs project listing) as well.

New member application for Sterling and Robin Benz was approved.

New Constitution update was provided. Due to Churchwide guidelines, Bethany must make changes to our Constitution to be compliant. Paula will make the changes but we will need to schedule approval at the annual meeting. Much discussion ensued without action.

Council discussed what to do about the Treasurer's position given Jill's term will end next year. Turnover at the Treasurer's position is a problem because it takes so much effort to get up to speed. Council will continue to brainstorm options.

Council discussed the "Little Free Pantry" idea requested by a member. This is similar to the "Book Library" seen outside of the Methodist Church but for other pantry items like toiletries and foodstuffs. Council thought it was a great idea and encourages the congregation to move forward with this project. No objections with it located on Church property were raised.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:21
