Books For Adults

The books this month are by Beverly Lewis who has been called "the queen" of Amish fiction. We have a number of books by her and this month will add the *Rose Trilogy* and *The Ebb Tide*.

Lancaster County, with the rolling meadows and secret byways, may seem idyllic, but it is not without its thorns.

The Rose Trilogy is the story of two Amish sisters, and the events and decisions that changes their lives. In volume one, *The Thorn*, we meet the Kauffman family. Rose Ann Kauffman, the youngest, has had a long close friendship with the bishop's rebellious foster son. Rose's older sister Hen, who knows more than she should about

falling for the wrong man, cautions her against him. Rose is being courted by another, and so dismisses her warnings. Hen Kauffman Orringer's impulsive marriage to an outsider divided her from the People. This is a decision she now regrets since she has a daughter of her own. In volume two, *The Judgment*, Hen struggles to reclaim aspects of Amish culture. Her very modern husband pushes back and the two soon come to an impasse. The reader wonders if she can find a way to reconcile her longing for the Old Ways with the life she has chosen./ In volume three, *The Mercy*, Hen cares for her husband after he is injured, uncertain what the future holds. Rose's relationship with her former suitor does not work out. She welcomes a second chance when she least expects it. Will it work out? You'll have to read volume three to find out what happens to Rose as well as Hen's marriage.

In *The Ebb Tide* we meet Sallie Riehl who has dreamed of traveling at least once before settling down to join the church. She is thrilled at an unexpected summer opportunity to be a nanny for a well-to-do family in Cape May. Saying even a temporary goodbye to Paradise Township, however, means foregoing baptism for another year, as well as leaving behind a would-be beau. The weeks in Cape May soon prove to be unforgettable as Sallie meets a Mennonite young man whose friendship she quickly begins to cherish. Has she been too quick in her promises? Will she only find what she is longing for back home?

Book for Children

How Roland Rolls by Jim Carrey is a story about a wave named Roland. He is afraid that one day, when he hits the beach, his life will be over. But when he gets deep he is struck by the idea that he is not just a wave — he is the whole big, wide ocean. The story shows humanity's interconnectedness through the metaphor of a wave in the ocean. Children need to feel part of something larger than themselves. This can be helped by time spent with parents and grandparents.

Direct Support Professionals Week

Do you know someone who is a caregiver to a loved one? It is often both a demanding and meaningful role. During September's National Direct Support Professionals Week, we celebrate all the ways in which these professionals help children and adults achieve their goals and build meaningful lives.

One way LSI is empowering lowans with disabilities is through our Respite Care program. We offer respite care for both children and adults, providing caregivers with a well-deserved break. Through respite, an individual is able to get out into his or her community and build a strong bond with a respite care provider. It's another way LSI is empowering the people we serve toward a more independent lifestyle.

It takes a village

Jessica felt overwhelmed. She spent most of her time caregiving for her daughters, Angelique and Ariana, and she knew she needed a break. She turned to LSI's Services for People with Disabilities. Through LSI, Jessica and her family could receive respite care for the girls, which gave her some time to take a break and catch her breath.

Angelique and Ariana now receive respite care from their providers, Kaitlyn and Megan. Once a month, Kaitlyn and Megan play games with the girls and get them out in their community, giving Jessica time to take care of herself.

Since last fall, Jessica has seen her daughters become more confident and independent as they've built a strong bond with their LSI caregivers. She is feeling more relaxed and in control of her parenting, and she is happy to see Angelique and Ariana find great role models in Kaitlyn and Megan.

"It was a big decision to open up and feel comfortable with respite care for the girls, but Kaitlyn and Megan have done wonderful things for them," Jessica says. "We're so appreciative for LSI's respite care, and having that resource is just wonderful."

Meeting called to order at 6:30 PM by President Lipes

Pastor led us in a discussion of tonight's Bible Passage which was Psalm 46:1-3. The passage focuses on how God brought order out of chaos at the creation of the world and how God continues to provide order to the world today. We then discussed how we personally respond to change and how we have learned to lean on God in times of challenge, change, fears, anxieties, and doubt and how God can be our refuge of strength if we allow him to be. We then closed with a prayer.

Pastor's Report: (Pastor Chad)

-Pastor had a busy month again with 9 in-home visits; conducted the confirmation service which saw 120 people in attendance; has been busy helping organize VBS; working on organizing a golf tournament with the elementary principal to raise \$ for the school backpack program. Pastor also had lunch with the Tipton ELCA minister and they have decided to do a pulpit exchange this September.

-Cheryl moved and Paula seconded that we accept the report. Motion passed

Treasurer's Report: (Jill Taylor)

-Jamie moved and Wayne seconded that we accept the report. Motion passed

Committee Reports:

Building and Grounds: (Jamie Zimmerman)

- -Have spoken with Robertson's on timeline to replace the Sanctuary shingles and they are still planning on late July although they are somewhat behind based on the cold, wet spring.
- -Have purchased all wood needed to reinforce the Sanctuary ceiling and Del has cut them to fit. We still need to measure the angle iron pieces and have them made. We have spent approximately \$75 dollars and will be spending another couple of hundred dollars on the metal angle pieces. The reinforcement project will not be done until later this summer or early fall when the weather cools down some as the attic is too hot to work in right now.
- -We have marked a number of milkweed plants on the eastside of the Great Hall in the landscaping and we ask that people not pull these as we want to leave them for the Pollinator Program.

Education: (Tonya Samuelson)

-VBS started today with 40 kids in attendance. We still don't have enough volunteers helping the teachers to monitor the kids and need to try and get more people involved. First day went well although it was very hot.

Evangelism: (Wayne Frauenholtz)

- -The mobile food bank will be in town June 20 from 3-5 PM and several members of Bethany will be assisting again
- -Talked about doing a follow-up with people who attend services occasionally as it is easy to attract people initially but harder to keep people coming on a consistent basis.

Fellowship: (Paula Casper)

- -The Synod will be holding a Candidacy Retreat here at our church in October
- -We don't currently have a 4th Sunday dinner volunteer for this month yet
- -Would like to have a summer fellowship event for members and the Fellowship committee is open to ideas if you have any

- -Captial Campaign for the Sanctuary Roof: No update at this time

The Council decided to narrow down the assignment to each individual council member interviewing 1-2 community members and reporting back at the next council meeting on the result of their interview(s). The potential list of interviewees was narrowed down and assignments were made.
- -God's Work, Our Hands: Pastor announced that this will take place on Sunday, Sept 10 and that we need to have a Council liaison to work with the congregation as this develops. We will discuss in more detail at our July meeting as well as potential projects we would like to pursue this year.
