Dear people of God,

Grace and peace to you! Recently, one of the faithful here at Bethany shared with me a passage from the Bible that meant a great deal to them. It was verses five and six of Psalm 126:

May those who sow in tears reap with shouts of joy. Those who go out weeping, bearing the seed for sowing, Shall come home with shouts of joy, carrying their sheaves.

I am so grateful this individual shared this passage with me. I am so grateful the living word of God continues to speak and these verses brought this individual comfort and strength. That is the power of God's word that continues to be alive in the world today. It continues to speak to us anew. It continues to help us through the challenges of life when at times we feel the absence of God. It continues to come to us and reveal to us the good news of Jesus Christ, the love of God revealed in the incarnation, death, and resurrection of God's Son. The Bible is the story of God's people and as people of God we are joined to that story.

When has God, through the power of the Holy Spirit, spoken to you? What Bible verse gives you strength or comfort? What passage carries you through times of doubt, despair, or loneliness? How does that passage help you live out your life as a person of faith? How does that passage call you to respond to God's grace freely given? We need to share those with one another. I have many passages that I cling to but one in particular has proven to be one I return to time and time again is the words Jesus spoke in Matthew 11 found above. These verses have been ones that I consistently return to, find strength and comfort in, and they remind me that I am not alone and that if I but put it into His hands the promise holds true that He will make our load lighter.

I would love to hear about those passages that are so important to each of you and somehow find a way to share those. I invite you to email me (pastor@wbbethany.org), slide a note under my door, or fill out an index card in the Great Hall and drop it in the box. You can share what you want - just the passage (please include name of book, chapter and verse, e.g., John 3:16) or you might *also* share a brief sentence or two about why this passage is important to you. How powerful would that be if we had those passages and then your personal testimonies of how they spoke to you, how they helped you, how they comforted you, how they strengthened you, etc.? Maybe we can then figure out a way to make these verses known, to share our stories of why these are important, and to simply remember that God is always with us, speaking to us, and guiding us along our journey of faith.

Bethany Books

Books For Adults

The common thread for the books in this month's newsletter is that they were all recommended to me by Pastor Chad. The first two books were written by David J. Lose who was professor of Biblical Preaching at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota. He also had served as Academic Dean. I noticed in a recent issue of *The Lutheran* that he had become the

president of our seminary at Philadelphia. I believe that Pastor Chad has come in contact with him during his continuing education seminars.

In *Making Sense Of The Christian Faith* the author introduces the essentials of the Christian story so that you can join countless others who have found energy and strength from the "God-talk" we call theology. If you wished that you knew just a little more about the Christian faith, or if you want to go more deeply into what you already know, or if you want to make sense of some of the many theological books and movies that are popular now, or just curious about God and the life of faith, then this book is for you. By looking at the seven parts (theological doctrines) of the Christian faith he explores the heart of Christian faith and just how important that can be to our daily lives. This book is written as a conversation that helps to draw the reader in and also reflect on what is being said.

In *Making Sense Of Scripture* he states that many of us find the Bible to be confusing at times with strange names and customs on every page. It is filled with kinds of literature that we do not meet anywhere else. Within the Bible we find everything ranging from poetry to genealogies and parables to legal codes. We often try to get more out of the Bible than a casual reading would give us. At least, that tends to be the aim of our Wednesday morning men's group. The Bible can be difficult and complicated but the author wrote this book to help us make sense out of this amazing book.

Lots of books, pamphlets, and booklets have been written through the centuries as companions for average people who wanted help finding their way through a complicated subject. Following Jesus is hard enough without having to navigate the rocky terrain of church culture all by yourself. *The Lutheran Companion* is the indispensable companion for anyone trying to become a well-informed church goer and have a good laugh/chuckle getting there.

Night by Elie Wiesel, which tells about his World War II concentration experiences, was referred to by Pastor Chad in one of his mid-week services during Lent.

Additional books that have been donated this month and added to the collection include: *Emerging Ministry: Being Church Today* by Nathan C.P. Frambach, *264 Great Outreach Ideas:*

For Individual Christians And For Churches edited by Joel D. Heck, Faith Begins At Home: The Family Makeover With Christ At The Center by Mark Holmen, and So What's The Difference? by Fritz Ridenour.

Books For Children

Children of God Storybook Bible by Archbishop Desmond Tutu is more than 50 Bible stories retold for children ages 4-7. They highlight God's desire for all people to love one another and to find peace and forgiveness in their hearts. Twenty artists from around the world have illustrated the stories portraying them in light of their own culture. The result is a truly global Bible for children. Each story shows how God's love works through history and ends with a short prayer.

Additional books of this type that we have are a number of Bibles designed for children. *The First Step Bible* is for toddlers. *My First Study Bible* is for children starting to explore God's word of their own. We also have the *Early Reader's Bible* and the *Bedtime Bible Story Book*.

Letters from the Council Retreat held April 26, 2014

Thus we seem to flounder sometimes in identifying/relating to the core mission of this church.

Challenges

Getting broad member commitment to being involved on a regular basis in the work of the church

Become more focused on the practices of faith (prayer, Bible Study, etc.)
