

Expectations of Pastor and Congregation

Affirmation of Baptism

Affirmation of Baptism (also known as Confirmation) is a ministry of the whole congregation. It is a lifelong process grounded in Baptism and instituted by the church in an effort to further nurture and strengthen the believer's faith in the Triune God: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. As a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) this program will teach according to our Lutheran understanding of Scripture and doctrine.

Objectives

Students will learn:

- God created them with unique gifts and through Baptism has joined them to the body of Christ, the church.
- They are saved from the power of sin and death solely by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ.
- Martin Luther's *Small Catechism*
- Knowledge of the Bible, the written and living word of God.
- An understanding of affirmation of Baptism as a lifelong process rather than a one-time event
- They are a precious child of God whom God and their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ love unconditionally and beyond human comprehension.

Expectations of Students

- Attend Wednesday confirmation class regularly and make arrangements to complete work if classes are missed.
- Bring all materials needed for class including: writing utensil, Bible, Student Handbook and any other materials you may need.
- Come promptly on time so classes can begin and end on time.
- Attend worship regularly and submit at least 2 worship notes per month and serve in worship as a Minister of Christ's Light (Acolyte).
- Complete service project(s) as required.
- Pray for Pastor Chad, any lay leader, and your fellow peers during the week. Pray for your parents and family.
- Be respectful to your peers and love them as we our Lord commands us to do.
- Listen.

Expectations of Parents

- Pray for and with your children. (Parents promise at Baptism that they will "teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments.")
- Worship regularly with your children. (Parents promise at Baptism they will "faithfully bring them to the services of God's house.")
- Talk about your faith with your child.
- Make certain your student is present and on time for worship and classes.
- Read assigned Bible passages and discuss reflection questions sent out in advance with your child.
- Volunteer as needed including, but not limited to, being an adult presence during class.
- Support Pastor Chad and/or any other lay leaders with respect to class rules established to make it an effective learning environment for all students.
- Talk with your son or daughter about what they are learning and walk with them during their lifelong journey of faith.
