First Fruits

"First fruits" is a complicated biblical concept that has many interpretations which have been used in many circumstances. For example, often fall stewardship campaigns use it to remind congregations that we should "give from our abundance first" as opposed to waiting to give to God what is left once we pay our bills. This is not really the point. I am not a biblical scholar nor do I profess to have insights into the meaning of "first fruits" or even "stewardship" for that matter. What I do know is that both giving "First fruits" and being a good steward of God's earthly kingdom are far more than giving money to the church and arguably help define us as Christians.

James 1:17-18 gets as close to my understanding as I can find:

"Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, as from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. In fulfillment of his own purpose he gave us birth by the world of truth, so that we would become a kind of first fruits of his creatures."

While the meaning of this passage might be obtuse, what it means to me is very simple: First "...with every perfect gift..." means to me that God has bestowed on us many gifts, all of which are perfect and cannot be corrupted. Some are rich, some can sing, some are homeless but reverent to the Glory of God. All of these gifts are the first fruits of Christ meant to be shared, nurtured such that they prosper and grow—shining the light on the glory of God always. As "...first fruits of his creatures" to me means that we are the leaders...showing the way...letting our gifts shine as an example to all that the Glory of God will set you free.

As we enter the stewardship campaign, reflect on your "first fruits" both as steward and as offspring of the Lord. Consider what "perfect gift" you have that you can share with the Church. Only through a strong commitment to doing the work of God can we hope to be truly free until we see the final Kingdom! What are your "first fruits" and "perfect gift"? Jon Twing

Luke 12:13-21
