Did You Know...

In the past three months:

-we've delivered 24 bags of food to the Food Pantry.

-the Hope Chest has helped 7 people.

-the Fourth Sunday Free Meal has served 84 people from our community.

-As a result of money donated to the West Branch Area Religious Council (WBARC) at year-end and generous gifts given in the offering on Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday, WBARC donated \$600 to help fund the Weekend Backpack Food program through the West Branch School system. This helps provide food over the weekend for 16 youth in our community. Also, WBARC housed an individual in a domestic violence situation overnight at Day's Inn until the situation deescalated.
