
Dear Faithful People of God,

I continue to ponder the words from Luke 24 (see picture to the right), even a week after we read them in worship Easter morning. I believe that is the power of God's living word to continue to speak to us, shape us, transform us, and bring near the presence of the risen Christ.

However, this year, more than others it seems these Easter words spoken by the angels to the women at the empty tomb are lingering with me. Being people of the resurrection, these words ought never be far from our mind, yet this year they seem to be with me every second of the day.

And so I wonder, just what is the Spirit trying to open my mind to? What is it about these words that apply to our life together and the future of what God is doing here?

Personally, I believe God is calling me to carefully look at those places in my own life where I seek the living among the dead. That is, those places and things in which I devote time, energy and resources that ultimately don't lead to growth, goodness, or new life.



I believe this may be the same message God is calling us as a community of faith to ask ourselves. Where are we looking for the living among the dead? What is it we may be clinging to for life that no longer is bearing forth the fruits of the Spirit?

"He is not here, but has risen." The women were commanded to go and proclaim this news to the others and so are we. It is our calling as people of the resurrection. What are we willing to risk in order to carry out this calling and increase our ability to reach those beyond the walls of our building and be the body of our risen Lord in the world?

Bethany Books

Books For Adults

The books in the article this month were all mentioned and highly recommended in the February issue of the *Living Lutheran* magazine. Developmental psychologist Dawn Rundman takes an understanding of brain science, couples it with the importance of faith formation and adds a personal touch and the result is a useful guide and resource – *Little Steps, Big Faith: How The Science Of Early Childhood Development Can Help You Grow Your Child's Faith.* This is a good book for new parents or anyone seeking to pass on faith traditions.

In a world of pain, mistrust and hatred, how can we break the barriers that separate us? In *We Need Each Other: Responding To God's Call To Live Together* we read talks given by theologian Jean Vanier 10 years ago after a year of violence and bloodshed in Kenya. They still ring true today. His message of meeting Jesus in those we are prone to neglect or reject leads us on a path to Christ and a realization of how much we all need each other.

On The Brink Of Everything: Grace, Gravity And Getting Old by Parker J. Palmer sounds like a book solely for people like myself who carry an AARP card and are thinking of the end of life. Like many of us the author uses writing as a way to understand his own questions, fears, and hopes. The book is grouped into seven sections, with the aging process and the wisdom and challenges that come with it. It covers topics such as the dance of the generations, writing a life and where we go when we die. "Age brings diminishments, but more than a few come with benefits. I've lost the capacity for multitasking, but I've rediscovered the joy of doing one thing at a time. I'm more aware of the loveliness of simple things: a talk with a friend, a walk in the woods, sunsets and sunrises, a night of good sleep." This book might seem on the surface to be mostly about death but it is actually more about life. It is not one to be finished in a rush and then on to the next one. I found it better to read slowly in sections to savor rather than gulp down in a single sitting.

Book For Children

The World Jesus Knew: A Kid's Guide To Life In The First Century by Marc Olson encourages readers to expand their knowledge of what we know of the ancient world where Jesus taught and lived. What plants grew in the area? What was Roman rule really like? What did people wear and eat? How did they spend their time? Children will enjoy the responses to these and many other questions. Filled with illustrations, charts, diagrams, and other information this book gives us a look at a world that is unfamiliar, yet important, to our understanding of Jesus.

BETHANY LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES—March 2019

The meeting was called to order by President Hughes at 6:35 p.m.

Members present: Del Hughes, Wayne Frauenholtz, Nancy Bruns, Linda Black, Curt Casper, Dave Bahnsen, Alan Beyer, Tonya Samuelson, and Pastor Whaley.

Members absent: Cheryl Fischer.

Pastor Chad opened the meeting with a devotion based on 1 Peter 2:9.

Pastor's Report:

Wow! It seems we just met. I will keep this report brief as it has been just a few short weeks since our last meeting. During that time, I have had 16 pastoral visits. Some other happenings include watching a webinar with Al Beyer pertaining to legal matters within the congregation. A variety of topics were discussed from insurance, employment, children and youth safety, etc. I am pleased to say Bethany is doing quite well in complying with most of the items that were presented. Also, Scott Marsh, Paula and I met to discuss Turning Point and continue to move this forward. The March newsletter summarized what we are doing during Lent and plans are underway for a future project. We will also be gathering with the entire group soon via a webinar and will additionally have a short meeting with just Pastor Uthe, Assistant to the Bishop. Thanks again Scott and Paula. Tonya, Amber, and I have reworked our Wednesday Faith Formation schedule to recover some lost instructional time as the result of winter weather. We will be meeting on Wednesday evenings during Lent from 5:45 to 6:15 p.m. prior our dinner and worship. Plans were finalized for the upcoming Men's Bowling Night (April 6). This is a joint event with Trinity Lutheran in Tipton. Bethany's planning team consisted of Al Beyer, Mike Fryauf, and me. Following last November's snowstorm, work is being done to plan for future events such as this. A small team has been formed to discuss and research our options. I will be going to worship with the men of Free Indeed at the Anamosa State Penitentiary again on March 30th. Our Wednesday evening in Lent will kick off this week. The Wednesday Faith Formation families will be providing the meal. I will be gone March 20 and Scott Marsh will lead worship. Pastor Jacqui Berlien will be with us during worship on March 17th. Ash Wednesday worship services went well at West Branch United Methodist church. We had approximately 15 people at the noon service and probably 60 - 65 at the 7:00 p.m. service.

Secretary's Report: Linda moved and Nancy seconded to accept the secretary's report with two corrections. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Income: \$10,813.85

Expenditures: \$15,103.49

Extra expenses during February included a new office computer to replace Paula's which had broken, ICON for church record keeping, and snow removal. Al moved and Curt seconded to accept the treasurer's report. Motion passed.

Committee Reports:

Building and Grounds: Curt thanked Del for obtaining furnace filters. He changed some light bulbs and fixed a toilet. The old vacuum cleaner doesn't do well with the pews and surrounding areas. He is looking at an inexpensive more versatile vacuum for this area. The water heater died and was replaced by Lynch's Plumbing.

Education: Tonya said that the $4^{th} - 6^{th}$ graders chose to use monies collected from "noisy coin offerings" during Lent to purchase "critters" from the ELCA Good Gifts Program. They have a goal of \$700 with which they can buy a "Family Farm" from Good Gifts, which includes an educational training component.

Evangelism and Missions: Alan said that 3 to 4 people will be going to Anamosa for the prison ministry on March 30th. Many names were listed on the Talent Forms to assist with Hope Chest and with the Food Pantry, so a schedule is being formed for greater involvement of members in these important missions of our church.

Fellowship: Wayne is organizing the Lenten suppers which begin this week and also the 4th Sunday Suppers. Stewardship: Dave gave a talk during the Sunday service on stewardship, which includes wisely using God's resources.

Worship and Music: Linda sent a letter to the Synod Newsletter and was able to find a church that could use our old paraments.

Youth: No report.

Old Business:

- A. Parking lot: Jamie is drafting a letter to be distributed which will describe the project and ask for pledges.
- B. Snow removal: Curt Friis has offered to do snow removal for the parking lot when he is available.

- D. Del asked council members to bring a list of goals for this year to our next council meeting.


