From the Partor

Dear Faithful People of God,

I was on vacation when the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's Churchwide Assembly gathered in Milwaukee. The Churchwide assembly occurs every three years and is "the prima-

ry decision-making body of the church." (For more information visit: https://www.elca.org/ChurchwideAssembly)

Resting and relaxing, driving and hiking, in and out of available wi-fi and cell phone coverage and often without access to a television, I wasn't too focused on the proceedings of the assembly until I returned home. Now, I am trying to catch up and familiarize myself with the decisions made and will soon be attending a gathering hosted by Bishop Michael Burk of the Southeastern Iowa Synod to learn more about the happenings of the 2019 Churchwide Assembly.

One important decision, which as I understand, garnered quite a bit of attention in the media, was on the ELCA declaring itself a "sanctuary church body." Perhaps, like myself and many others, you may be wondering just what that means? In a letter issued shortly after his visit to the Churchwide Assembly, Bishop Burk writes, "When many people hear that term [i.e., sanctuary] these days, it stirs passions less because of the biblical warrant to welcome the stranger and to provide protection for the most vulnerable, and more because of the turmoil that divides individuals and groups when contending with a broken, often inhumane, system and set of laws related to immigration."

In most of the contexts in which we find the word "sanctuary" in the Bible, it carries the meaning that a sanctuary is a sacred place where God will dwell and make God's home among God's people. When we sing, "Lord, prepare me to be a sanctuary..." in worship we are really offering to God a prayer to abide in us and make our bodies a sanctuary of God. They are sanctuaries used by God to partner in God's mission to walk alongside the vulnerable, love our neighbor, and strive to work for justice and peace in the world.

The ELCA will be working to provide clarity to congregations about what being a "sanctuary church body" means; but, what it certainly is not intended to be is something that should further cause division among us. Agree or disagree on immigration laws in this country, I believe the life and ministry of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, the story of God as found in the Bible, and our faith instills in us the fundamental truth we all can agree on and Bishop Burk notes, "God has chosen to dwell among God's people. Among all people, including the most vulnerable. All of God's people, including us."

I will have a time to learn more and discuss this decision on Monday, September 30^{th} at 6:30 p.m. at the church.




Sunday Adult Discussion

Pastor Chad opened the meeting with prayer.

Pastor's Report:

- Men's Bible Study (We are watching and discussing a video series on Jesus and his Jewish influences)
- Session with my leadership coach (from Leadership school attended last June)
- Concluded Wednesday night faith formation o Final night of activities, Root Beer floats, and singing
- VBS meetings
- Turning Point o Meeting with Scott and Paula o Attended second Saturday training session (June 1) held at Synod Center for Ministry in Iowa City
- Mission Event o Meeting for golf tournament to fund all childhood hunger related programs in our schools (K-12)
- Attended West Branch graduation and several open houses of our graduating seniors

In all these events (and other I could have listed), I observed Christ's presence in a variety of different ways: in the people, in the singing, in the planning, in seeing faces we haven't seen in a while, through the word and sacraments of worship, and the love we share with one another.

Secretary's Report: Two reports were presented: the May Council Minutes and the Special Meeting for the parking lot on May 19th. Wayne moved to accept the special meeting minutes from May 19th. Curt seconded. Motion passed. Linda moved to accept the regular May minutes with corrections. Nancy seconded. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Offerings for the month were \$11,333, which is under budget with year to date offerings also below budget. General fund expenses totaled \$11,968 for the month, which is also below budget, but slightly more than the offering, so a net decrease of \$635 to the general fund for the month of May.

We received \$4,000 in parking lot donations and an additional \$2,000 in Memorial funds designated for the parking lot. The month end amount in the parking lot fund is \$16,350.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds: Curt thanked Linda for her work on the north side of the church.

Education: Vacation Bible School began today led by three counselors from EWALU. 23 students are registered. For a community service project, the students will make birthday bags which will be given to the Food pantry for distribution. Tonya thanked Amber Marsh and Paula Casper for their leadership. She invited any new ideas and options for next year's VBS.

Evangelism and Outreach: Bethany will again be attending the Free Indeed service at Anamosa on June 29th. Beth Ahrens for Trinity in Tipton will join us. The prison ministry there has requested 15 With One Voice hymnals from us. We will take them along at our visit.

Bethany assisted with HACAP on May 21st.
This next month we will begin planning for God's Work
Our Hands Sunday held on Sept. 8th.

Fellowship: Wayne has scheduled a meeting with Scott Marsh and Tara Langley about making a new church welcoming brochure. He thanked the Hughes for serving the 4th Sunday Meal last night.

Stewardship: Dave was unable to be present but wanted us to know that he is scheduled to introduce the Athanasian Creed at Trinity Sunday service this week. He is also working with Paula and the Weissman's on archiving old congregational pictures.

Worship and Music: Jill approached Linda about using Bethany on Wednesday evenings for a community choir practice. Pastor Chad mentioned that he often uses the sanctuary for his confirmation class. Linda will continue to investigate this further.

Old Business:

- * Parking Lot: The contract for resurfacing the parking lot by LL Pelling has been signed. The work is expected to be done in August.
- * Tree Removal: Kent Kaufman has offered to fell the two trees during the second week in July. The stumps will need to be ground down, and Lumpa's will be contacted for this.
- * Sidewalks: Del has received three bids for sidewalk repair, each a little different in approach. Stransky's bid just under \$8000 for the entire sidewalk replacement. S & S Concrete bid \$7540 for repair of the drainage problem by the driveway and broken sidewalk sections. Concrete Polyfix bid just under \$5000 to lift and slope the sidewalk towards the street. Curt moved to authorize the Building and Grounds Committee to accept the best sidewalk improvement option. Wayne seconded. Motion passed.
- * Bell tower: A contract with West Branch Roofing for \$2700 has been signed for repair of the leaking bell tower.
- * Cookie Walk Funds: A discussion was held about using the \$563 in the Cookie Walk Fund. Linda said that Candy and her committee suggested that the earned monies be spent for needs in the community since that is who supports the cookie walk. Tonya mentioned that the Sunday School kids wanted to purchase a Family Farm Project from the ELCA Good Gifts program. Linda moved that the funds be divided between the public library needs and the ELCA Good Gifts program. Curt seconded. Motion passed.
- * There was some discussion on committee goals for the year.

New Business:

- * Church grounds beautification: Linda has been working on plantings on the north side. John Black took out the dead Japanese maple there with his tractor. Curt offered to check the eaves and downspout to prevent erosion. He also offered to trim back the lilac bush by the entrance.
- Designated Shelter: Five Bethany members met with Cedar County Emergency Management Director Tim Mallott and his assistant on May 15th about being a designated shelter for West Branch. A good discussion about logistics, rules, insurance, and organization followed. It was decided that the best role for Bethany would be to serve as an overnight shelter. Al has already picked up vacuum packed linen sets, blankets, and pillows. Cots will arrive later. Curt moved that Bethany be declared as a Designated Shelter. Wayne seconded. Motion passed.
- * Linda moved that we approve Alex Poppen, Hannah Schiele, Aiden Shields, and Andrew Samuelson for confirmation at Bethany on June 30th. Nancy seconded. Motion passed.
- * Pastor Chad requested the council's approval for a 3 or 4 day period in the fall for time at a retreat center. Council approved.
- * Because of the many building and grounds projects, Al moved to authorize Nancy to transfer up to \$7500 from the Mission Investment Fund if needed. Linda seconded. Motion passed.

Next meeting will be held on July 8th at Mexico Lindo Restaurant. Spouses are invited.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

There will be no minuets for July 2019 as the Council members met in July for dinner and enjoyed some food and fellowship.


Acolyte Training
