

Dear Wonderful People of God,

"Be Grateful!" At the December Council Meeting during the opening devotion the question was posed, "What does our group or congregation need to hear from God at the end of this year

together?" Several fruitful responses were given, but one spoke to me and continues to do so and perhaps might speak to our congregation as we move into 2020 – "Be grateful!"

Some people grumble that roses have thorns.
I am grateful thorns have roses.
(Alphonse Karr)

Perhaps, this resonated with me because recently I have begun Affirmation of Baptism (aka Confirmation) class asking the students to name one thing they are grateful for that night. I have challenged them; they can't continue to use some of the more obvious responses such as family, food, friends, house, etc. It's not that these aren't wonderful answers that each of us is indeed grateful for; however, I want them to begin to see that thorns have roses. It didn't take all that long and soon they began to list items such as the chair they were sitting on or the pen they wrote with.

God is about transformation and I believe a mindset of gratitude is one way God helps refocus our eyes to see the world as God sees it. Suddenly, we may move from a mindset of scarcity to one of abundance. Or, we may move from a mindset of glass half-empty to one of glass half full. Or, we may move from grumbling about the thorns on the roses and instead appreciate that thorns have roses.

I believe something else happens when we choose to put on gratitude. We acknowledge the goodness in our lives, in others, in the world and we recognize the source of that goodness often lies outside of ourselves. It helps reorient all we are and all we have is a gift from God.

So, will you join me and our confirmation students in putting on and practicing gratitude this New Year? For Christians, as the Apostle Paul notes, our gratitude is the result of the indwelling of Christ in each of us. Be grateful beloved saints!

Books For Adults

Living With Hope series is published by Fortress Press. Our library has three titles from this series: Waiting For Good News: living with chronic and serious illness by Sally L. Wilke, Jobs Lost, Faith Found: a spiritual resource for the unemployed by Mary C. Lindberg, and Dignity And Grace: wisdom for caregivers and those living with dementia by Janet L. Ramsey.

Waiting For Good News is organized around seven questions that those who face serious illness ask. The heart of this book is the stories. From them the reader will find

the strength, support, and a way to face difficult situations. Wilke offers tools, tips, ideas, and resources for reflection and for obtaining additional support.

Jobs Lost, Faith Found is for those who feel alone due to job loss. It is also for those who offer respect, companionship, guidance, and resources to the unemployed. The author draws on her family's experience with unemployment and the wisdom of others. Readers discover a sense of worth and purpose on their way to a new job. The path toward hope will be the reader's own but the ideas, reflections, and strategies in this book will help get you started on the journey.

In *Dignity And Grace*, the author draws on her own experience as well as interviews with eight family and professional caregivers. She helps caregivers and those with impaired memories learn as they listen to each other. Whether a diagnosis of dementia arrives suddenly or gradually, this illness reorganizes a family's entire life. She also shows them how the Holy Spirit can awaken their imagination and understanding while they discover how to live with dementia.

Whether you are new to Bethany or a long time member, sometimes it is helpful to review basic Lutheran doctrine. The Lutheran welcome series with the illustrations by Daniel Erlander and hand-lettered text are helpful materials to use for this purpose. The titles include:

Finding Her Community

Originally from Eritrea, Kiros, her husband, and her young son were forced to flee their country and live in an Ethiopian refugee camp for almost two years.

When the opportunity came to resettle in Iowa, Kiros and her husband were excited to put down roots and call Iowa home. They settled in the Des Moines community and knew this was it; this was where they wanted to create a new life in the U.S.

Since then, they have raised four more children and set their sights on receiving citizenship in the country that helped them heal and rebuild.

Kiros enrolled in LSI's English and citizenship classes and worked hard to study for her U.S. Citizenship Exam. Every week, she met with instructors from LSI's Refugee and Immigrant Services to prepare for her interview with U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services.

When the time came, she passed her exam with flying colors. She recently attended her U.S. citizenship ceremony, then went home to prepare for her daughter's fifth birthday party.

Kiros has poured her time and energy into building a life where her family has the same opportunities as every other family in their community.

Children's Christmas Program



Treasurer's Report:

The October General Fund Revenue and Expense report reflects income of \$12,257 and expense of \$13,264 for a net decrease of \$1,007. The fellowship expenses include \$283 for the synod meal, which will be offset by the payment from the Synod. The general fund balance is at \$1,683, so we will need to make a decision about transferring money out of the Mission Investment Fund before the end of the year.

Curt moved and Alan seconded to approve the treasurer's report. Motion passed.

Committee Reports: Building and Grounds:

The carpet in the Great Hall needs to be cleaned and will be scheduled tomorrow. It will cost \$400 to \$500 to do it.

There is some yard work to be finished around the church if the weather cooperates.


