

# **Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) News**

#### **National Child Abuse Prevention Month**

According to the Iowa Department of Human Services, 8,967 Iowa children were subject to abuse or neglect in 2018. The most common forms of abuse included denial of critical care, physical injury, exposure to illegal drugs or dangerous substance, and sexual abuse.

Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) helps combat child abuse through prevention, safety, and stability services, as well as mental and behavioral health care.

Through regular in-home visits to families, LSI's Early Childhood Services prevent child abuse by giving parents the support, education, and resources they need to build a healthy, stable home for their children. In 2019, our Early Childhood programs provided more than 11,000 in-home visits to families.

LSI's Family Safety, Risk, and Permanency Services help children and families already involved in a crisis or abuse situation to become safer and more stable, and LSI's Bremwood and Beloit Residential Treatment Centers serve many children and youth who have experienced trauma from past abuse or neglect.

#### A Future Full of Hope

She was expecting her first child, and she felt stressed and overwhelmed. She didn't have a job or a home to provide for her new baby. When she was referred to LSI's Early Childhood Services, she didn't know if the program could help her. But after just two months with her LSI worker, Jaqashia says the services made a life-changing difference. Her LSI worker, Pam, helped Jaqashia find an apartment. Every week, she visited Jaqashia in her new home to provide helpful parenting tips she could use to raise a happy, healthy baby. With a comfortable home ready for her child, Jaqashia felt confident and empowered to find a job. And Pam was there, ready to encourage her and walk alongside her every step of the way.

Jaqashia is now the proud mother of a baby boy, A'Kani, and she is determined to be the best parent she can be. Pam still stops by for her regular visits but now, Jaqashia feels ready to raise her son in a safe and loving home.

"LSI made a huge difference. They made a big positive change," Jaqashia says. "I feel very confident that I can actually raise my son now, and I have my own place. I'm feeling great."

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

General Fund revenues for January were \$12,692 and expenditures were \$12,116.

Emergency Shelter volunteers needed background checks and \$57 was spent from the Internal Missions Fund. \$475 from the 2018 Cookie Walk Fund is designated for library snack bags and the remainder will go to the Youth Noisy Coin Fund. \$857 from the 2019 Cookie Walk has yet to be designated.

#### **Committee Reports**

**Building and Grounds:** Curt said that snow removal is doing well.

**Education and Youth:** No report.

#### **Evangelism and Outreach:**

FreeIndeed service at the Anamosa penitentiary on February 1<sup>st</sup> was led by Pastor Chad. His service was well received by the inmates. Al Beyer and Beth Ahrens also attended.

The Memorial Fund committee met and decided on three designations: new candle lighters, a replacement for the current projector, and a new tree for the parsonage yard.

Old Business: None.

#### **New Business:**

The new Fidelity Bank requires a document and signatures from the congregation signifying who has been designated to conduct financial business with the bank. Anne moved and Curt seconded to send a letter listing the Executive Committee members for this purpose. Motion passed.

Bethany's 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary: Al offered to begin forming a committee to celebrate this event. He mentioned having a float in the Hooverfest parade as well as a special Sunday to celebrate the event.

Del read from a letter from the Synod which invited Bethany to share a video commemorating our 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with the Synod Convention in May. A discussion was held concerning the production of this. Dave mentioned that the video to be shared doesn't have to be long. The convention will also feature Bishop Burk's retirement.

Linda moved to adjourn at 7:38 p.m. Dave seconded the motion. Motion passed.
