We ask you to recreate us, to reconnect us, and to restore to us the vision of your life in creation, and the power to live it. Amen.

We come to hear God's promise to make all things new in Christ Jesus.

There is no faithfulness or loyalty, and no knowledge of God in the land.


Swearing, lying, and murder,

And fill us with your blessing,


Until needy no longer,
