"Stand firm, and you will win life." - Luke 21:19 (NIV)

During my undergraduate studies at the University of Northern Iowa I



Dear beloved brothers and sisters in Christ,

participated in many intramural sporting activities. One in particular stands out still to this day. At that time, dormitories were divided into "houses." Our house formed an intramural team. Simply participating in an activity provided the house points regardless of whether you won or lost. Thus, that spring at the intramural track meet, I signed up to run the 400 meter race, which is one time around the track. In that day, the meet was held on a seldom used old cinder track. I entered with the mindset that I would just casually go out, run at a leisurely pace, and rack up some participation points. Well, the competitor in me just could not do that, so I sprinted out of the blocks. As I rounded the final turn I realized there were three of us running side-by-side out in front of the others. I could see the finish line and could not wait to cross it ,so I gave it everything I had. Well, in doing so my upper body got slightly ahead of my lower body and my feet gave way on the cinder track and down I went. To those who may have never fallen on a cinder track, consider yourself lucky.

As we find ourselves in Holy Week, it's all too easy to want to rush ahead to Easter Sunday and the good news that Christ has risen and bypass Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Yet, these two days are so vital to our understanding of who Jesus is. He is the one who came to serve and not be served. He is the one who came to give his life for the sake of the world. We cannot get to the empty tomb of Easter without going through the agony of Good Friday and the cross Christ died upon. We must journey through the grief and suffering of our Lord to truly grasp the great love revealed through his death and stand in awe with the women at the empty tomb Easter morning.

In the text above from Luke, Jesus teaches the disciples there will soon come a time when they will be persecuted, thrown into jail, be betrayed, hated and even experience death on account of Jesus' name and their steadfastness to bear testimony to the gospel of Jesus Christ. Jesus orders them to "stand firm" and in so doing they will "win life" through what Jesus has done through his death and resurrection.

We cannot have one without the other. We, too, are called and empowered by the Holy Spirit to stand firm, persevere, and not get ahead of ourselves in our race to celebrate the glorious light of Easter. We are indeed a people of new life, resurrection, and hope; however, we are also a people that gathers Sunday after Sunday at the foot of the cross remembering how much the Son of God gave so we could stand in the light free from the burden of sin and death. Free to love God and free to love one another.

Books For Adults

Love Is The Way: Holding On To Hope In Troubling Times is by Michael Curry. He is the presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church. Many people in America know him from when he delivered the sermon on the redemptive power of love at the royal wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle at Windsor Castle. In this book he expands on his message of hope in an inspirational road map for living the way of love. It shows how America came this far and how we can go a whole lot further. The

way of love is important for addressing the seemingly insurmountable challenges facing the world today: poverty, racism, selfishness, deep ideological divisions, and competing claims to speak for God. The purpose of this book is to explain what the way of love looks like, even as we walk in a world that feels at times closer to a nightmare than to a dream. The way of love is how we stay decent during indecent times. This book will help the reader discover the gifts needed in order to live the way of love: deep reservoirs of hope and resilience, simple wisdom, the discipline of nonviolence and a regard for human dignity.

3-Minute Devotions For Women is a collection of 180 inspirational readings. Take time to pause and reflect by reading scripture, encouraging words, and a prayer starter to begin a conversation with God. Most days we are seeking a moment or two of inspiration and encouragement. Within this book you will be guided through right sized readings that you can experience in as few as three minutes. No matter what your day brings, this source of inspiration can be just the pick-up that you need in your faith walk.

Books For Children

All Because You Matter is written by Tami Charles and illustrated by Bryan Collier. "They say that matter is all things that make up the universe: energy, stars, space... If that's the case, then you, dear child, matter." So begins a lyrical tribute filled with heart, hope, and affirmation. While there are many nice people in the world, not everyone is. Sometimes people will treat others unfairly because of their skin color, race, or religion. This was written as a starting point for conversations about the racial climate in our country today. All children, especially those from marginalized backgrounds, matter.

You Matter by Christian Robinson is another book that reassures the young child that they matter.

National Child Abuse Prevention Month

According to the most recent lowa Department of Human Services data, 9,532 lowa children were subject to abuse or neglect. The most common forms of abuse included denial of critical care, physical injury, exposure to illegal drugs or dangerous substance, and sexual abuse.

Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) helps combat child abuse through prevention, safety, and stability services, as well as mental and behavioral health care.

Through regular in-home visits to families, LSI Early Childhood Services prevent child abuse by giving parents the support, education, and resources they need to build a healthy, stable home for their children. In 2020, our Early Childhood programs provided more than 18,000 in-home and virtual visits to families.

LSI Family Centered Services help children and families already involved in a crisis or abuse situation to become safer and more stable, and LSI's Bremwood and Beloit Residential Treatment Centers serve many children and youth who have experienced trauma from past abuse or neglect.

Empowering Iowa Families

Gaylene was overwhelmed raising three young boys. Finances were strained and she and her partner, José, worked hard to make ends meet. Suddenly, well into her second trimester, Gaylene learned she was pregnant with her daughter, Julieanna. Left with less time to prepare her home for a fourth child, Gaylene was stressed at the thought of welcoming a little girl into a house with three energetic older brothers. And once Julieanna was born, Gaylene began experiencing postpartum depression.

Gaylene enrolled in LSI Early Childhood Services for help, and she and José began meeting with their LSI worker, Kellie. She provided the family with age-appropriate ideas and developmental activities for the kids, and served as a shoulder to lean on whenever Gaylene or José needed guidance or advice. Gaylene recently graduated from college with a degree in early childhood education, and her family is thriving. Gaylene also graduated out of LSI services last year. The family still keeps in touch with Kellie, and Gaylene says she will forever be grateful for the support she received when times were difficult.

"We got so used to Kellie coming to our home for five years, it's going to be different. But now I know where to turn and how to help my family down the road," Gaylene says. "I feel like Kellie and LSI actually care about people and parents."



The meeting was called to order by President Hughes at 6:30 p.m.

Council members were installed as elected church leadership, bringing gifts to serve the congregation, and supporting our mission in Christ.

Pastor's Report

Take Away Hunger Program 2021 Style

The need for food continues throughout the world more now than ever. Bethany Lutheran has been working with Take Away Hunger (formerly Kids Against Hunger) for over 12 years by having food packaging events. With safe, Covid-social behavior in mind, let's have a packaging event this Spring!

We are proposing having multiple teams of family units to separately come into the fellowship hall to package the food. These family units should all be comfortable being around each other. Mike Fryauf will be assisting with each team. A team would package during their assigned time slot. When they are finished, the packaging line will be fully sanitized before the next team arrives and work their assigned time slot.

These food packaging events have 2 parts:

- 1) Raise money to pay for the supplies and
- 2) Assemble the food packages.

How to Package

The standard food packaging production line consists of 10 people:

- 1 material handler
- 4 fillers
- 2 bag holders (surprisingly the hardest job)
- 1 fill balancer
- 1 sealer
- 1 boxer

For the new line, Mike Fryauf will be the material handler. Depending on how big your team is, a proposed packaging line would consist of:

- 2 Fillers (could be 1)
- 1 bag holder
- 1 fill balancer
- 1 sealer
- The boxing can be done at the end.

This team structure has 5 people. We can make a smaller team if necessary, but the workload would need to be juggled. The number of teams will depend on the interest and the amount of money that can be raised.

Raise the Money

Each meal serving costs 25 cents. Each bag that is filled has 6 servings. There are 36 bags in a box. The donations required for a box is \$54. Any amount of money can be donated, but we have traditionally requested donations for a half box (\$27) or full box (\$54). Take Away Hunger has developed a new recipe that appeals to a North American diet. There are usually "mistakes" that the team can bring home and sample!
