Acts 2:42



Beloved People of God,

Shortly upon receiving the promised Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost, many who gathered were left in awe and wonder and subsequently asked Peter and the other apostles, "What should we

do?" (v.37) Peter responded they should repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus. A few verses later we read that about 3,000 people were baptized. In the very next verse, found above, we learn what else that young church did.

It would seem we are missing so much. Surely, there must have been many a meeting to figure things out. Planning needed to be done. All the logistics that come with a new community consisting of many different people had to be worked out, which surely brought some differences of opinions.

Luke doesn't seem interested in that. Rather, he gets right to the heart of the matter emphasizing what that early church deemed important in their life together. As the book of Acts progresses, we know many obstacles do in fact come their way including persecution and imprisonment. In the twelfth chapter we find Peter in prison and learn, "the church prayed fervently to God for him." (Acts 12:5)

Prayer was part of the DNA, the lifeblood, of the community. Not just individual prayer, but communal prayer sustained them through thick and thin. The church "devoted" themselves to prayer. Continually. Passionately. Fervently. For one another.

Certainly, prayer is something we do during worship together and is a vital component of our worship. Yet, I have been wondering is there more? What would it look like as a community to pray fervently and to continually devoting ourselves to prayer ... together? What might happen?

I give thanks for your prayers. I know many of you pray daily. I know we have a small team of prayer partners who faithfully pray for the people of Bethany. The early church models the importance of prayer together. Meaningful, transformative, outward focused prayer for the community. Will you join me in prayer inviting the Spirit to help us discern and dream together?

#### **Books For Adults**

There are books that provoke action and those that provide a blueprint for taking action. In *The World Is About To Turn: Mending A Nation's Broken Faith* co-authors Rick Rouse and Paul Ingram give us a book that aims to do both. Reading less like an instruction manual than a travel companion on the road toward healing a broken world, this book pulls out insights, invites exploration and provides inspiration. The first set of chapters are sure to spark conversation and maybe a little disagree-

ment if read in a group. A set of reflection questions follows each chapter. The last part of the book aims to educate readers about various faith traditions and perspectives, encouraging interreligious cooperation and helping the work of healing our divides. The final chapter aims to put the theoretical work of the first part and the insight of the next part into practical steps anyone can take to start building bridges in these hyperpartisan days. This book would be a good fit for anyone wondering how they can begin to approach today's most pressing social issues. (recommended in the *Living Lutheran*)

Finding Home by Julie K. Aageson shows that finding home is complicated. This is for those who know the security of home and those who do not. Home is characterized by joy and sorrow, grief and gladness, the realities of complicated lives. What is it like to flee the horrors of war as a refugee in search of home? When daily life is unbearable, what exactly does home mean? How do we learn to be at home in our bodies, at home with ourselves? What does it mean to be made in the likeness of the Holy One? Can we find home in the company of strangers and how do we reclaim our earth home? Home, however, is more than a house. These reflections invite readers to explore identity, the importance of rootedness, discovering home away from home, and what it means to be home for one another. Home defines who we are and what it is that gives our lives meaning. Finding home is challenging. (recommended in the *Living Lutheran*)


#### **Book For Children**

Through our innovative Host Homes program, caregivers can also become mentors to individuals with disabilities, welcoming them into their private family home where they can receive more one-on-one care and encouragement.

It has been a challenging year for parents of children with disabilities, and there are lots of lowa families who deserve support right now. #### Where are They Now: Amanda and Mavis

Amanda has lived with her Host Homes mentor, Mavis, for three years and continues to gain more independence through the program. When Amanda first entered Host Homes, she required multiple psychiatric hospital visits throughout the year. She had been living in a busy home with roommates, and she needed a new environment to thrive.

When she moved in with Mavis, the two worked together to build important life skills for Amanda and find ways for her to cultivate her creative mind. Amanda loves listening to Elvis music, sewing, and ceramics, so Mavis helped Amanda enroll in art classes. When she was no longer able to attend during the pandemic, Mavis ensured she had space at home to continue creating art. Amanda recently finished a major ceramics project: a replica of Elvis she has been working on for three years.

Amanda continues to work on her goals, including personal hygiene, exercise, medication management, and cooking. Throughout the pandemic, Mavis and Amanda spent lots of time in the kitchen, and Amanda is now able to cook independently. She loves trying new dishes, and her favorite foods are pasta recipes. And instead of several emergency calls and hospital visits each year, Amanda has not needed mental health hospitalization in more than a year and a half.

"I think I'm doing really well, I've been doing lots of things," Amanda says. "I want to do even more amazing things too. I really like it here."



At its August 9<sup>th</sup> meeting the council reviewed current guidelines as it pertains to COVID-19. With increased positivity rates due to the spread of the Delta variant, the council encourages all people, regardless of vaccination status, to wear face masks indoors. This is based on recent CDC recommendations for areas in substantial or high transmission, which Cedar County presently falls into.
