Dear Beloved Saints,

You are loved! It is the love of God in Christ Jesus that has sustained us for 126 years. Jesus came proclaiming the good news of the king-

dom. He came down to reveal this great, abundant, and glorious love of God to the world. The women were sent to proclaim this good news upon learning Christ had risen, and later Jesus commissioned his disciples to do the same. That, too, is what we are called to do as the body of Christ.

In his greetings to the congregation as our church celebrated its 75th anniversary, Pastor Peter Vammen (1940-45) wrote, "We are reminded that every blessing we have, in church and community, especially the precious gift of salvation, comes to us because Christ loved the church and gave Himself up for it on the cross."

At the same anniversary, Pastor Doliver Thogerson (1949-57) wrote, "For seventy-five years Bethany Lutheran has had as its mission the proclamation of God's love in Christ. As you pause to reflect on these years of grace and opportunity, may you be filled with joy that you have been privileged in sharing in the work of bringing the Gospel to people."

Pastor William Thalacker (1961-69) wrote, "There is no challenge or no problem too large for his [i.e., God] power and love. There was abundant opportunity to witness that power and love during the years we lived with you all."

I give thanks for these former pastors' faithful words of wisdom. I give thanks for every pastor who has served alongside the faithful people of God at Bethany and has proclaimed the good news of Christ's love. I give thanks for all of you and every saint who has come before us in carrying out the church's mission to proclaim God's love in Christ.

What started with three benches in a home in 1895 was transformed by the Holy Spirit into a sacred people and place with Christ and his love as its cornerstone. Much has happened in our rich and long history, but as these three former pastors lift up a few things remain constant. First, we abide in the abundance of Christ's love. Second, our mission is to share that love with one another and with the world. Third, God is one of opportunity, and everything we do as a people of God is an opportunity to glorify God and bear witness to the amazing love of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It's not always easy work. At times we stumble and falter. There were times bills couldn't be paid. A fire forced us out of our worship space as did a global pandemic. Yet, we are reminded, "There is no challenge or no problem too large for his power and love." In Christ's peace! — Pastor Chad

Books For Adults

In 12 Tiny Things, Ellie Roscher and Heidi Barr journey with us through twelve essential areas of life - space, work, spirituality, food, style, nature, communication, home, sensuality, creativity, learning, and community. They invite us to take one tiny action at a time to open up growth and renewal. In a culture that says bigger is better, it seems subversive to take tiny lasting steps toward learning and growth. Tiny things can make all the difference. (recommended in the Living Lutheran)

No matter how many meaningful relationships we may have, it is a rare person who does not feel loneliness. *The Great Belonging: How Loneliness Leads Us To Each Other* by Charlotte Donlon explores loneliness, especially how it is felt by Christians. She uses research, personal stories, literature and visual art to get at the heart of the condition, rather than fix it or avoid it. According to many sources, loneliness has reached epidemic proportions. In an age of mobility and fraying civic life, we are all susceptible to its power. She reframes loneliness and offers us a language for the disquiet within. When we inhabit a posture of curiosity, we discover loneliness does not have to be scary. The author wants to show readers that they are not alone. She wants to normalize loneliness and encourage people to have conversations with others. She wants people to ultimately discover eventually that loneliness has less power over them. (recommended in the *Living Lutheran*)

Book For Children

Do You Love Me? is written by V. Gilbert Beers and illustrated by Jan M. Jones. This book is part of the "Learning to read from the Bible" series. It seeks to introduce the child to new vocabulary. It also presents doctrinal objectives and relates them to present-day objectives. (donated)

And because of this, kids are empowered with the ability to choose their own supplies that show off their own styles and personalities so they can feel confident as they return to classes.

She wasn't in the mood for a visit but after arriving at the office, she found a bright spot in her day: her LSI worker was there to help her pick out a new backpack of her own. 


Food Pantry News
