Book For Adults



When I finished college a number of years ago, most young people after high school or college then went to work and soon after got married and started a family. Today a new trend appears to be taking place. Young people after their education have started to wait a number of years before getting married and many have returned home. This is the subject of the book *Doing Life With Your Adult Children: Keep Your Mouth Shut & The Welcome Mat Out* by Jim Burns. Some people think that parenting stops at eighteen. If you have an adult child,

you know that it is not the case. It gets more complicated. You are as involved as ever, whether your child lives under your roof or rarely stays in contact. There are no formulas or job descriptions for making the transition to an adult-to-adult relationship. The author touches on a number of key areas such as: Is it okay to give advice to my grown child? What is the difference between helping financially and enabling? What boundaries should I set if my child moves back home? How do I relate to my grown child's significant other? How do I support my grown children when I do not support their values? This book contains positive principles for encouragement in your changing role that never ends.

Full Of Grace: The Story Of Mary The Mother Of Jesus focuses on her final earthly days ten years after the Resurrection. If there is one person in the gospels who had the experience of living thirty years with Jesus from birth through His Resurrection, it was Mary. After a full life with Jesus - fleeing into Egypt, losing him in the temple and seeing Him placed on the cross - Mary lives her final days in reflection. She awaits the arrival of the apostle Peter. When he arrives, he expresses the overwhelming responsibility of preaching amidst heresies and conflict. After receiving encouragement that only a mother can provide, Peter rediscovers the truth: that he is not leading but is following and walking in the light of God. (donated)



Penelope had been in and out of residential treatment at various facilities across lowa for a few years. Her most recent placement was at LSI's Bremwood Residential Treatment Center in Waverly, which provides 24/7 behavioral healthcare and support for children and teens.

Upon her arrival, Penelope was able to build a relationship with the new LSI Spiritual Life Leader, Pastor Kyle. The voluntary Spiritual Life program connects youth on Bremwood's campus to faith-based music and art, youth group, and chapel sessions. After Pastor Kyle had begun to settle into his new call with LSI, he began hosting a worship service each week for children on campus centered around the eucharist. Penelope enjoyed participating in worship and encouraged her peers to join in.

One day while talking with Penelope, Pastor Kyle asked her what got her so excited about worship and why she encouraged her peers to attend.

"Dude," Penelope responded. "It's because we get communion!"

As Pastor Kyle continued the conversation with Penelope, the two discussed the importance of communion and how being fed through the bread of life empowered us to live amongst and for our neighbors.

As we celebrate Valentine's Day this month, Penelope's story about receiving the sacrament of communion helps us to remember that our love for one another is possible through the one who first loved us. No matter who we might receive valentines or sweet treats from on Feb. 14, we trust that all are embraced in love through Jesus Christ.




