Dear beloved and precious saints,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father, and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

This Sunday draws to a close the Epiphany season and moves us into the season of Lent. Each year on this Sunday the church gathers for

Transfiguration Sunday to hear the story of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ's face suddenly changing and his clothing become dazzling white. I find it a story difficult to wrap my head around and even enter into. It just seems so surreal and other-worldly.

In many a congregation, the hymn "Shine, Jesus, Shine" will be sung. There are two verses to this hymn, which are so poignant for our lives as his faithful followers.

Lord, the light of your love is shining, in the midst of the darkness shining; Jesus light of the world, shine upon us, set us free by the truth you now bring us. Shine on me.

As we gaze on your kingly brightness, so our faces display your likeness, ever changing from glory to glory, mirrored here, may our lives tell your story. Shine on me.

We may wrestle to understand that mysterious mountaintop experience, but through it we once again are reminded of the light of the world shining in our midst. Book For Adults

Shine On, Beautiful Soul is a book for friends. Friendship is a beautiful thing. Whether newly found or cherished for years, friends are who we turn to when we need prayer, and who reflect God's love and goodness in our lives. This book celebrates friendship with encouraging messages, art, and words from God.

Magazine

This is a column that talks about books and sometimes a DVD. This must be the first time that I have mentioned a

magazine. The one that I am about to mention is the monthly magazine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church. It has been variously called the *Lutheran Standard, The Lutheran,* and now the *Living Lutheran.* Each issue starts with an editor's note giving the theme for that issue. The feature articles give stories of God's people living their faith. The departments include letters to the editor, a page where a writer tells why they are a Lutheran, a media in ministry article where I sometimes get an idea for a book for our library and others. There even is a crossword puzzle. On the last page of each issue is an article from our presiding biship. At one time, I think that every member of Bethany received an issue of this magazine. Interest was not high enough to keep this up. We still get several copies and they are placed on the rack by the hall book display. I think that it is important that we realize we are a part of a larger church outside of Bethany. This magazine helps to keep us in touch with it.

DVD

This DVD was filmed in both Krakow, Poland and Rome. *Pope John Paul II* follows the pope's life from his younger years to his last days. The film opens with the attempted assassination on his life on May 13, 1981. From there he reflects on his earlier life. The movie then picks up in 1939 as the Germans invade Krakow. Ultimately, he decides that the best resistance is not physical, but intellectual. Keeping Polish culture alive would help keep Poland alive. He ultimately decides to enter an underground seminary to become a priest. The German occupation of Poland is replaced by a different form of tyranny, that of the Russians and their desire to create a Godless society. Later as bishop and archbishop, he stands up to the communists. After the death of Pope John Paul I, he is elected at the age of 58 as the first non-Italian pope in 455 years. The film shows the pope's support for the solidarity movement and the ultimate fall of communism. Pope John Paul II sees his survival of the assassination attempt as an opportunity to lead the Church into the mil-

lennium. His world travels, popularity with young people, and teachings are detailed. This film was produced by the Ignatius Press. They do a good job in capturing the life of Pope John Paul II, but be warned - it is three hours in length.

Helping Kids Thrive

Janey was transitioning from elementary school to junior high, and she was experiencing anxiety about the big jump. She was worried about meeting new kids and new teachers, and she would have panic attacks whenever her mom would wake her up for school. Last year, when kids across the state were already feeling added stress and pressure, she missed weeks of school at a time.

Her family knew she needed extra encouragement and a shoulder to lean on. They found it through LSI Behavioral Health Intervention Services (BHIS), which provide in-home programming for lowa children and teens with severe emotional or behavioral disorders. Through the programming, families can practice developing skills like healthy communication, anger management, and problem solving.

Through LSI's BHIS programming, Janey was able to build coping skills to help her calm down and avoid overthinking worst-case scenarios about her school day. With her LSI worker, she practiced relationship skill-building – how to build friendships and stay away from others who could make school time hard. After working on these skills multiple times each week, Janey was able to succeed in her classes. She went from failing several classes due to missing school to recently receiving a certificate showing she was on the honor roll.

Wednesday Evening Fellowship & Prayer around the Cross


