Dear beloved, faithful, and wonderful servants of Christ,

Lent is a journey. Faith is a journey. Life is a journey. Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ's mode of transportation was walking and a lot of it. A quick internet search reveals several results estimating Jesus may have

walked over 3,000 miles during his 3-year ministry based on accounts of his travels as documented in the four gospels and potentially over 20,000 miles during his lifetime. We are told many times Jesus went off to pray, sometimes up a mountain. Having returned from a week in the mountains of North Carolina that included several miles of hiking, I imagine Jesus traversing similar narrow, winding, solitary, quiet trails as he sought to replenish his body: mentally, spiritually, emotionally, and physically.



Over the years, I have learned just how therapeutic and healing a hike can be, even a short one, for the mind, body, and soul. While reflecting on a recent hike, the idea of some form of hiking ministry surfaced in my mind. What might that look like? Who might be interested? I cannot help but think it was the Holy Spirit that breathed within me this idea.

While we may not have the mountains of Colorado, the waterfalls of North Carolina, the forests of Appalachia, or the glaciers of Montana, there are some trails nearby that showcase the beauty of Iowa. Jesus did ministry on his hikes. He ate with the multitudes. He revealed the kingdom of God. He healed, taught, and experienced the abundance of God's creation. He prayed.

## Bethany Books

### Book For Adults

*Little Faith* by Nickolas Butler is told through the eyes of 65 year old Lyle Hovde. He explores a sincere view of the relationship between young and old, father, daughter, and grandson, life and death, faith and doubt, in a way in which all ages can relate and empathize. Questions of faith are posed with both the simplicity of the main character and the complexity of the larger world around us. In a Midwestern town Lyle and his wife Peg live out their days in relative simplicity. They are still living in the

same town in which they were born, still attending the same church in which Lyle was baptized and married and in which he expects his funeral will take place. They are surrounded by the familiar. Lyle's previously estranged daughter has returned, along with her five year old son, Isaac to live with Lyle and Peg. She becomes involved with an extremist church and a charismatic pastor that causes disruption among the family and even threatens the safety of young Isaac. Spread over a year, amidst the dynamically changing Midwestern seasons, *Little Faith*, explores connection, community, family, and loss while posing deep, fundamental and thought provoking questions of faith and belief.

### DVD

When we study a person or an event, it is usually helpful to understand the environment in which it took place. One of the last topics that the men's bible study class undertook pre-Covid was *Jesus And His Jewish Influences*. It is a part of The Great Courses program. This study consists of 24 episodes. This is led by Professor Jodi Magness of the University of North Carolina (Chapel Hill). In this course, Judaism was traced from its origins with the arrival of the Israelites in Canaan (c. 1200 B.C.) to the rise of Rabbinic Judaism (2nd-3rd centuries A.D). The greatest focus is on the latter time period. What did it mean to be a Jew in the late Second Temple period? Jesus was a product of the Judaism of this time. Episode 1 Jesus The Jew and Episode 24 Jesus's Teachings And Sayings In Context speak to this. There is also a course guidebook that sums up each lecture and has additional information. This is a good coverage of the topic but you need to have available time to cover a lot of information.

### National Child Abuse Prevention Month

According to the most recent Iowa Department of Human Services data, 10,539 Iowa children were subject to abuse or neglect. The most common forms of abuse included denial of critical care, physical injury, exposure to illegal drugs or dangerous substance, and sexual abuse. Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) helps combat child abuse through prevention, safety, and stability services, as well as mental and behavioral health care.

Through regular in-home visits to families, LSI Early Childhood Services prevent child abuse by giving parents the support, education, and resources they need to build a healthy, stable home for their children. In 2021, our Early Childhood programs provided more than 11,000 of these in-home visits to families.

LSI Family Centered Services help children and families already involved in a crisis or abuse situation to become safer and more stable, and LSI's Bremwood Residential Treatment Center serves many children and youth who have experienced trauma from past abuse or neglect.

### Creating Bright Futures

When Makenzey found out she was pregnant, she felt nervous and overwhelmed at the thought of being a first-time mom. She didn't know what to expect, but she wanted to create the best life for her child. While she was pregnant, Makenzey enrolled in a local service that provides free housing to expecting moms. Through the organization, she learned about LSI Early Childhood Services. With support and guidance from her LSI Parent Educator, Hannah, Makenzey prepared for a healthy birth and transition into motherhood. "Being a new mom was really scary for me. I had no idea what I was doing," Makenzey says. "I needed to learn the basics."

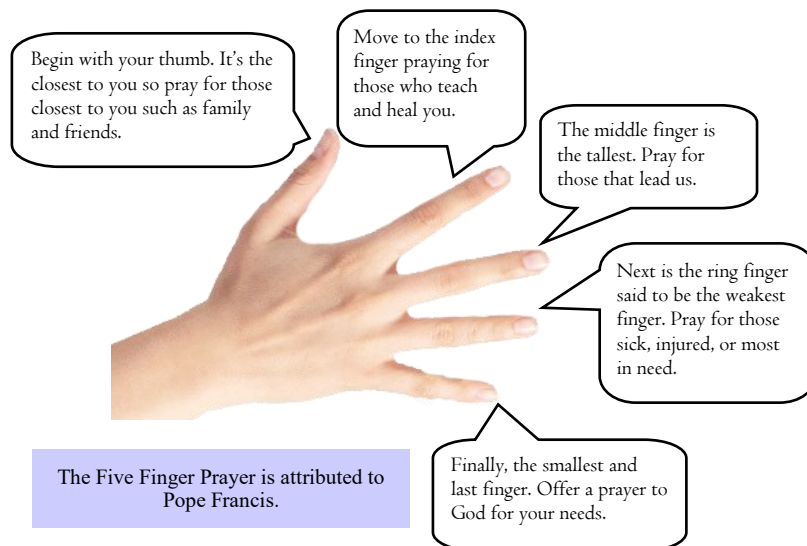
Since Makenzey welcomed her daughter, Maleigha, she has since found a job she loves and saved enough money to find a home for her new family. Through it all, Hannah provided check-ins with Makenzey, introducing her to important resources, educational materials, and age-appropriate toys and activities to ensure Maleigha hit all her developmental milestones.

"Especially when you're a first-time mom, you'll have a lot of questions. I don't have a ton of support right now, but Hannah helped me and answered every question I had about being a mom," Makenzey says. "LSI has been a really helpful service."

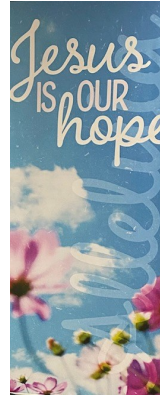

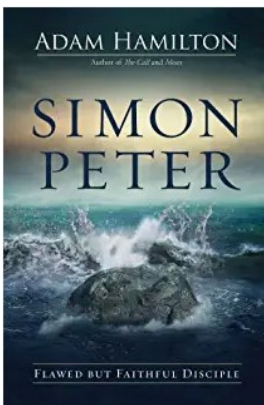

### What is the Paschal Candle?

"The paschal candle (sometimes called the Easter candle) is a large decorated candle that symbolizes our Lord's glorious Easter triumph over the darkness of death and sin. It is reminiscent of the pillar of cloud and fire that led the people of God to the promised land. Paschal candles have been used in worship since at least the fifth century." - *Altar Guild and Sacristy Handbook*; S. Anita Stauffer; Augsburg Fortress, 2000.

The paschal candle is lighted throughout the season of Easter and for every baptism and funeral.

Our gospel reading for Easter this year is from [Luke 24:1-12](#). Following the encounter of the women with angelic figures at the empty tomb of our Lord and the announcement that he had risen, the women go and tell Jesus' disciples about this good news. Highlights from this month's Pastor's report include: Joys and Thanksgivings include gratitude to outgoing council members for their faithful service and our newest council members Kent, Howard, and Cindy. We celebrate our children in worship and the joy, energy, and life they bring to our community, along with the continued generosity and faithful stewardship of God's people in meeting our ministry needs.

Ministry activities this past month included the funeral of Jim Peak, pre-marital counseling for an upcoming July wedding, Confirmation planning and collaboration with Amber, visited the Children Faith Formation class, attended five extracurricular school activities of Bethany youth, 12 pastoral visits, and made several phone calls to parishioners.

As treasurer for WBARC, I write thank-you notes on behalf of the group as WBARC was blessed with some wonderful gifts. The WBARC committee continues to explore ideas and ways in which we can steward the financial gifts we have received in meeting needs within our community.

Participated in the Monday Gospel Gathering Bible Study and Southeastern Iowa Synod Nominating Committee. Asked by School Superintendent to serve on a recently formed Anti-Bullying Committee to evaluate and brainstorm solutions to increased bullying within our schools

## Why does worship pause some times on Facebook?

On occasion, those viewing online may experience momentary delays as we stream worship. This is frustrating for all of us. From our end, we have made certain the wireless routers have the most current firmware, verified we are using the most updated version of our internet browser (i.e., Chrome, Microsoft Edge), and weekly check for any updates to the laptop used in streaming worship. We continually test and do our best to stay current on technological advancements.

Additionally, there are things those joining at home may want to check as well. They include:

- Check to make sure your wireless router has the most current firmware installed
- Check to see if there are any updates to your phone, tablet or computer
- Try clearing your browser's cache/history (IOS devices automatically do this)
- Disable any unnecessary plug-ins on your web browser
- Make certain your web browser is up to date
- Try using a different internet browser
- Check video and network drivers on your computer for any updates
- Run a test to check your internet download bandwidth using a tool such as: [speedtest.net](https://www.speedtest.net)
  - At a minimum a download speed of 5 Mbps is recommended, 10 Mbps is ideal
- Log out and back in to Facebook
- Check to see if there are any updates to the Facebook app
- Remove the Facebook app and reinstall it
- Reboot your wireless router
- Reboot your phone, tablet or computer
- Check the available memory space on the device you are using as insufficient memory can create problems
