

were quite ignorant of their faith. With the many changes that were taking place under the Reformation people were not sure what to believe. Luther then wrote the Catechism for instruction in the home and church on the main statements of the church. Luther was very skilled at writing and was able to put it in the language of the people. Luther's writings had an effect on the development of modern German. This book regards Luther's words as being already so clear and profound that nothing more need be added. But understanding the theology and history behind the words can be helpful. Knowing how this reflects Luther's own life and thought can open up its proclamation of the gospel. The text is supplemented by pictures, maps, and woodcuts.

Unafraid: Life Lessons: Sermons to live by and tales of listeners learning to live unafraid is by Harold Ibsen and Joy Ibsen. I think that this book about a Danish-American pastor in the American Midwest would appeal to many here at Bethany. After Harold Ibsen died after serving seven congregation's his daughter Joy reconstructed sermons of his from his notes. They follow the church year: Christmas, New Year, Epiphany, Lent, Good Friday, Easter, Pentecost, Trinity, and Advent. This book unveils parish ministry as a 24/7 affair. She offers not only her father's sermons but the impact that her father's ministry had on the members of the congregations that he served. Harold Ibsen served as a pastor during times of great hardship and challenge, World War II and the Cold War. Nevertheless, the people we encounter in this book develop courage and resilience in their struggles, in light of the good Word they are given from the pulpit. It shows how our lives are relational, that our stories and lives are intertwined with the lives and stories of others, and ultimately with God. This helps us to be unafraid wherever we go and whatever we do. This is not just a collection of old sermons but also an insight into the thoughts and actions of his parishioners. (donated)




