Book For Adults

Bittersweet: How Sorrow And Longing Make Us Whole by Susan Cain is a book that should especially appeal to introverts. The author reveals the power of a bittersweet outlook on life and why we've been blind to its value. Bittersweetness is a tendency toward states of longing, poignancy, and sorrow. It is an acute awareness of passing time, It is a curiously piercing joy at the beauty of the world. It recognizes that light and dark, birth and death, bitter and sweet are paired. She explores why we experience sorrow and longing and how embracing the bittersweetness

at the heart of our life is the path to creativity, connection and transcendence. Cain shows how a bittersweet state of mind is the quiet force that helps us transcend our personal and collective pain. If we do not acknowledge our own heartache, she says, we can end up inflicting it on others via abuse, domination, or neglect. If we realize that all humans know or will know loss and suffering, we can turn toward one another. At a time of discord and personal anxiety, *Bittersweet* brings us together in deep and unexpected ways. Explore why we experience sorrow and longing, and the surprising lessons these states of mind teach us about creativity, compassion, leadership, spirituality, and love.

First Communion Education


Is your child ready to start receiving the sacrament of Holy Communion? A tentative date for first communion instruction has been set for Monday, October 3 at 6:30 PM.

D. wanted to become more connected to her community, while still ensuring she could receive the care she needed on a daily basis. Through LSI, D. has been able to enroll in the Host Homes program, which provides 24/7 care for individuals with disabilities and mental illness who thrive in a one-on-one setting instead of a busier group home environment.


D. was able to move into a private family home with her Host Homes mentor, Anita, and they have built a friendship and a shared social life. Anita is there to support D. as she works on her personal goals, while D. is still able to get the care she needs.

Currently, one of D.'s goals is to exercise and become more active in the community, so the duo enjoys shopping and walking around the local mall to stay active. Back at home, the two can work on skills – like hygiene and cooking – that make D. feel more independent and confident.



July Council meeting – should we cancel and resume in


