1 Chronicles 29:14 (NRSV)

Dear Servants of Christ,

It is fall and in many congregations that means there is a focus on stewardship. Your stewardship team recently has been telling the story of the many ways your financial gifts are being utilized to do God's work here within our congregation and beyond in our community and world (See page 4). Thank you, thank you for your faithfulness! Together, with the help of God, we are proclaiming the good news, making a difference, and reaching out with the love of Christ.

In my sermon on September 25th, I quoted theologian Mark Allan Powell from his book *Giving to God The Bible's Good News about Living a Generous Life* (2006 Wm. B. Eerdmans Publishing Co.). He writes:

The Sunday offering is a worship event that provides us with an opportunity for expressing our love for God in the purest way imaginable, by giving up something that we value.

He makes note that in ancient Israel, the people of God would bring grain offerings, birds or small animals. The grain was placed on the altar and burned. The living creatures were killed. These gifts were things they valued, and this was done as an act of worship.

I find it hard to comprehend the giving of an offering that ultimately is destroyed. Couldn't those gifts be put to a better use? This is the response of those gathered around a table with Jesus as an unnamed woman anointed him with expensive oil (Mark 14:3-9). Jesus' response points to the fact this was an act of love, devotion and worship.

Or consider the Magi who come to see the Christ child and present gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh (Matthew 2:1-12). We are not told about the practical value of such gifts or what Joseph and Mary did with them. What we do learn is their gifts were a "pure act of worship" and "devotion" to the newborn Messiah. The Magi don't seem at all concerned about what they will get out of their gift or how it will be used.

The fact the grain was destroyed or the animals sacrificed by the ancient Israelites seems not to be the point. Rather, the significance is they, "had been touched by the goodness of God." They "wanted to worship God, and they did that by taking something that belonged to them and giving it to God in the only way they knew how."

Powell doesn't disagree with the fact we are called to faithfully steward our offerings and put them to use in the world to glorify God; however, he seeks to highlight an ethic of stewardship as found in the Bible that starts with worship. Giving motivated by the goodness of God and our love for God.

I am grateful to Powell for his work. I know in the past I have said something along the lines of "Thank you for your gifts. They are necessary to meet our needs." While not entirely wrong, I am rethinking my own understanding of "offering" and starting from a place of worship.

Thank you for your offering, your faithful act of worship and devotion to God! — Pastor Chad

We know that millions of people in the United States have dropped out of active church membership. Millions more are leaving each year. Faith After Doubt: why your beliefs stopped working and what to do about it by Brian D. McLaren is for the millions of people who think that their faith is falling apart. It is for the many people who show up Sunday after Sunday but feel that the bottom is dropping out. It is for all the people who dropped out of religion long ago but still dream that there is a way for them to be both spiritually curious and intellectually honest. The author uses his own story and the stories of a diverse group of struggling people to propose a model of faith de-

velopment in which questions and doubt are not the enemy of faith, but rather a doorway into a more mature and fruitful kind of faith. Religious people often find that the path into doubt is terrifying because they have been told their entire lives that they must accept certain understandings, beliefs, or dogma without question. The author helps the reader to find a deeper faith that is enriched by doubt instead of threatened by it. He feels that belief and doubt are not opposites but are actually sisters with whom an honest person of faith walks continuously. "I promise you: there is faith after doubt, and life after doubt, and life with doubt. If you thought life before doubt was good, wait until you see where doubt can lead you and what doubt can teach you." At the end of each chapter, there is a *Reflection and Action* section that offers specific questions, exercises, and practical guidelines to help you engage the chapter as an individual or as part of a small group. At the end of the book there are several appendices offering lists of resources including books, podcasts, events and classes. (donated)




