Over the past two years every aspect of our lives changed drastically because of the Covid pandemic—how and where we could work, eat, gather, serve and worship changed. Buildings closed and social gatherings were discouraged, but the Council, Pastor, and members at Bethany stepped forward to ensure

ministry continued. Through activities such as online services, Zoom meetings, and take-home faith formation kits we responded, in both word and action.

As we are returning to our church building and post-pandemic life, we are once again offering more ministries. We want to thank everyone for their gifts of time and money that help our congregation thrive and accomplish the many great things we do. Your financial support is vital to carry out the church's work. Whether we gather for worship inside our building, in our parking lot or online, we continue to be the body of Christ through our ministries, our witness, and our care for one another.

Your gifts of time help grow our youth programs, keep our church grounds looking nice, and help worship run smoothly. Your gifts of money help support our local ministries such as the food pantry, hope chest and fourth Sunday meals. They also support our synod ministries such as campus ministries and the FreeIndeed Prison congregation. It also allows us to staff and maintain the church building.

Every year the church council prepares a budget based on our best estimates of weekly offerings and expenses. We are beginning the budgeting process for 2023 and have some concerns. This year the offerings through September are running short by just under \$8,000 (just over 6%) and during September we had the unanticipated expense of the copier replacement for just over \$5,000. This shortfall in offerings and increased expenses will not only have an impact on 2022, but it will also affect our ability to support programs in the 2023 budget.

We have not done a stewardship pledge program for several years and do not intend to run one this year. We simply ask everyone to prayerfully reflect on what you can do. We hope that you will consider increasing your weekly offerings if able, so that we can continue to support the great ministries here at Bethany.

There are several different ways to conveniently donate ranging from the offering plate, to online donations which can be accessed by the blue Give Now button on our website, to automatic bank withdrawal (Simply Giving). Sign-up forms for the automatic bank withdrawal program are on the table at the base of the stairs as you enter the church. You can also find them on our website on the "how to give page."

Bethany Books by Frank Frostestad

This month the featured book is another novel by Beverly Lewis. *The Orchard* is the very latest book by her on the Old Order Amish. A number of you have, in the past, been interested in her books so I hope that you read this one. Besides being rich in the ways of the Amish there is usually a young women as the main character. This is no different. Ellie Hostetler has been brought up in Lancaster County on a farm that features an orchard that forms a backdrop for the story. Most of

these books discuss the coming of age of a person and their quest for a mate. This follows that pattern. The game changer and what makes this book unique is that it is 1970 and the United States is involved in the Vietnam War. Ellie is 19 and has a twin brother Evan who registered for the draft at age 18 as one is supposed to. What he did not do, as most Old Order Amish did, he did not file for conscientious objector status. The Old Order Amish do not want to have anything to do with government. They do not vote or hold public office, for example. They do not join the military. They have a deep belief in non-resistance. The family is shocked to learn that he did not acquire an exempt status. He is the one who the family expects to continue the family orchard business. His draft number is called up in the lottery and he is sent to boot camp. After advanced training, as an infantryman, he is sent to Vietnam. The faraway war that has caused so much turmoil and grief for others now threatens them. They need to carry on in a world that, for them, is changing. Other Amish look down on them for not seeming to have raised their son correctly. Plans that they had seem increasingly uncertain. Ellie and her family need to find the courage to face a future unlike any they could have imagined.







Sunday Bulletins

It had been suggested that we discontinue adding songs to the bulletin. We have a large online presence requiring a bulletin with the songs, so if we remove them from the printed bulletin, we would need to create two versions. Review to determine the cost savings of reduced printing offsets the time cost of creating two versions of the bulletin.

The council determined to continue creating bulletins as is. Establish a Budget Committee

Special Congregational Meeting September 25, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President Dave Poppen at 10:27 a.m. with 37 voting members participating in person and two by Zoom.

A committee was formed to review and recommend options for replacing the church's current copy machine. Dave Poppen presented on behalf of the committee, noting parts for our existing copier are no longer available and the committee recommends a replacement using funds from the Mission Investment Fund. The cost of the new machine is \$5,090 plus tax. Laura Twing moved that we accept the committee proposal, seconded by Kami Poppen. The members present unanimously approved the motion.

A special thanks to Scott Marsh and PIP Printing for creating worship bulletins and other printed materials during this time.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:40 a.m.

The goal of foster care is to reunite children with the parents when possible. The foster family can play an integral part in making that happen, often becoming mentors to the birth parents, helping them learn parenting skills they may not have had modeled to them.

An LSI provider told me about a picture she had recently received. Imagine, if you would, a photo of two women, one on each end of a bench, and four kids with them. All happy. All smiling. It looks like they were enjoying a beautiful day in the park.

On the left is the birth mother of those kids. She will be the first to admit, things haven't been easy – but she loves these kids.

The other woman is the foster mother. She loves these kids too. Two of the kids were adopted by the foster family, one lives with the birth mom, and the foster child on the mother's lap was soon to be reunited with the birth mom. They are celebrating Mother's Day together.

Foster families provide more than a safe place for children to land. This foster/adoptive parent is a wonderful mentor for this birth mom!


