Dear blessed communion of saints,

Recently, I was reviewing the words located in the liturgy of "Affirmation of Baptism" in our hymnal, *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* (Copyright © 2006 Evangelical Lutheran Church in

America; published by Augsburg Fortress, Publishers). The baptized are asked the following question (p.236), "Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism?" That is lived out in the following ways:

- To live among God's faithful people
- To hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper
- To proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed
- To serve all people, following the example of Jesus
- To strive for justice and peace in all the earth

As we affirm our baptism, we respond "We do, and we ask God to help and guide us." Leading into a new year, I am pondering the second bullet point, "to hear God's word." The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's (ELCA) website says (https://tinyurl.com/4k3kyzdm):

There are many ways we hear God's Word:

- The public reading of Scripture
- Preaching
- · Bible study, devotional reading and retreats
- · Sacraments
- · Experiencing the Arts
- · Forgiveness of sin
- · All aspects of a congregation's educational ministry
- Continue the fellowship of the Lord's Supper through meal time prayer at the dinner table

I am pondering ways that may be of assistance in hearing God's word. Scripture is a primary way in which God's word is revealed to us. As the Apostle Paul reminded the church in Rome through the reading of scripture we find hope and endurance.

In 2023, every newsletter will feature the texts used in worship every Sunday (see page 4) of that month. My hope is this will be a resource to assist all of us enter more fully into the passages each Sunday. Use these passages in the week leading up to Sunday. Bethany Books

This month I plan to feature magazines that provide some helpful information to our biblical literacy. The first is *Biblical Archaeology Review*. It is helpful in understanding a biblical text to have some understanding of the physical and cultural environment in which it takes place. Articles include one on pilgrams and immigrants in Jerusalem in the time of Herod. An article on the desert origins of Yahweh and how the ritual practices influenced Israelite worship and religion. One article explains how David was able to defeat Goliath with a sling. There

are many other articles that shed light on the practices and archaeology of the time. (donated)

The next magazine contains 25 stores of the bible featuring *Women Of The Bible*. This is done through text, photographs, and paintings. The introduction features what lessons we can gain from their lives. Part I on the Old Testament features Eve, Lilith, Sarah and Hagar, Rebekah, Rachel and Leah, Zipporah, and Miriam. Part II Ancient Israel features Deborah, Delilah, Ruth, Bathsheba, Jezebel, Judith, and Esther. Part III The New Testament features Mary, Elizabeth, the Samaritan Woman, Mary and Martha of Bethany, Salome, Mary Magdalene, Priscilla, and Thecla. (donated)

The third magazine is the *Atlas of The Bible*. It uses text, photographs, and paintings to illustrate exploring the Holy Lands. The use of many maps are particularly helpful in guiding the reader to understand the text. Part I highlights the key narratives from the creation to the great flood, from the stay in Egypt to the exodus and the promised land. It then follows the rise of the Israelite kingdoms to the conquest by Assyria and Babylon. Part II highlights the key narratives from the four Gospels that form the core of the New Testament and well as stories from the Acts of the Apostles and the letters of Paul. (donated)

The fourth magazine is *Jesus And The Origins Of Christianity*. The life of Jesus is recounted and then the growth of early Christianity is followed. The Age of Expansion is next, the high point of the churches influence is followed by the Renaissance. It ends with Christianity overseas and then with Christianity in the Americas. It uses text, photographs, paintings and maps. (donated)



A Journey of Overwhelming Joy

After going through fertility treatments and being told they weren't able to have any more kids, Dani and her husband pursued their foster care license in 2015 and have cared for 13 kids since. "Throughout our journey of being foster parents, we've had many great placements," said Dani. "Our shortest placement lasted five days when we cared for a girl, whose mother was incapable of watching her while she recovered in the hospital, and our longest lasted 18 months." Dani shared that one of their biggest blessings was having the opportunity to adopt some of the children they fostered. The family adopted their first child at age one, and they had plans to adopt another when the child turned 18 years old. "Every time our family adopts another child, I get the same feeling of overwhelming joy," said Dani. "I feel like any expectant mom —not being able to contain my joy when their adoption comes up, and telling everyone I know about it." Dani shared that it is hard to explain the full impact fostering — and the lows and highs it brings — has had on her family. "We've cried, stressed and lost a lot of sleep. We loved, laughed and had so many firsts," said Dani. "But I still tell everyone who is considering being a foster parent to do it. It's a roller coaster, but so worth it."


