Dear beloved saints,

In many ways 2022 was a year of renewal, restoration and healing in the life of our congregation. The annual report highlighted the many ways things returned to normalcy again. There was a

renewed sense of community and vibrancy in the work we accomplished in the name of Jesus Christ.

That does not mean we were not without grief and loss. We commended five saints to God's everlasting arms. Additionally, many of you encountered losses in your own families or friendships. The pain is still real and raw. You are not alone! Jesus, gentle and humble in heart, is present.

As people of faith, we place our trust in the healing and wholeness that only God can provide. We trust in the words of our Lord and Savior that he will provide rest for our weary and burdened hearts, bodies, minds and souls. May the peace of Christ be with us all!

Soon, we will move into the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday is February 22^{nd.} We will dawn the cross of ashen dust upon our foreheads remembering our mortality, while at the same time remembering the salvation that comes through the cross of Christ and his subsequent resurrection on the third day.

I hope you join us on Ash Wednesday, as well as Wednesday evenings during Lent (see the schedule on page 9). Returning this year will be a meal and time of fellowship. This time together is life-giving itself as stories are shared and our bodies are nourished by a warm meal.

Then, we will move to prayer around the cross. Words spoken, prayers offered, songs sung and candles lit will further focus on the Holy Spirit's ability to draw near, provide comfort, hope, and the steadfast love of God that surpasses all understanding. On the final Wednesday during Lent, the cross will again be traced upon our foreheads as a reminder that, "neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:39).

So, at Jesus' invitation, "Come to me ... and I will give you rest." Come and eat! Come and converse! Come and worship! Come and pray! Come and let him fill your hearts with his love!

Bethany Books



The book this month is *Our Missing Hearts* by Celeste Ng. Twelve-year-old Bird Gardner lives a quiet existence with his loving but broken father, a former linguist who now shelves books in a university library. Bird knows to not ask too many questions, stand out too much, or stray too far. For a decade, their lives have been governed by laws written to preserve "American culture" in the wake of years of economic instability and violence. To keep the peace and restore property, the authorities are now allowed to relocate children of

dissidents, especially those of Asian origin and libraries have been forced to remove books seen as unpatriotic. This includes Bird's mother, an author, who left the family when he was nine years old. Bird has grown up disavowing his mother. He does not know what happened to her. When, one day, he receives a mysterious letter, he is pulled into a quest to find her. This book is a work of fiction. It is the old story of the ways that supposedly civilized communities can ignore the most searing injustice. In the United States we have seen the effects from McCarthyism to the treatment of the "other" We have seen Indigenous children taken from their families and put into schools. More recently we have seen the separation of children from their families at the southern border. Hate crimes against the Asian-American community have increased since the beginning of Covid. How many books have been challenged in libraries? In a broken world, it is sometimes hard to see if any of us survive with our hearts intact.





Budget Review

The projected income for the 2023 budget is based on historical offering increases by about 2% each year.

It was proposed if we face a deficit of over \$5,000 in 2023, the council has the option to reduce the size of the local mission donation. The council did not accept this proposal since currently we have other funds that could be used to cover expenses.

2022 Local Missions Fund

Jill proposes we drop the UIHC Chaplaincy donation since there is not a chaplain staffed and then split the funds among the other five designated charities. Jill also proposes we keep the WBARC donation at \$400. Kent seconded. Motion approved.


