#### **GATHERING**

We gather in the name of the triune God, our healer, our hope, our only home.

We come to hear the promises of God, to pray for healing and for one another, to give and to receive the anointing of oil and the laying on of hands, and to be sent into the world as wounded healers and bearers of Christ's love.

Let us pray.


Lord Jesus Christ, by your goodness and mercy you guide your flock to still waters and green pastures where we are restored to abundant life in you, now and all the days of our lives.

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The Lord is my shepherd,


I shall not be in want.

they comfort me.



INVITATION TO THE LAYING ON OF HANDS AND ANOINTING AND PRAYER AT THE CROSS

A reading from James.

Are any of you suffering? They should pray.

Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise.

Are any among you sick? They should call the elders of the church

and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord.

The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up,

and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven.

Therefore confess your sins to one another,

and pray for one another, so that you may be healed.

James 5:13-16a

Those who desire the prayer of faith and the laying on of hands are invited to stand or kneel.

All who are drawn to be part of this ministry are asked to watch so that no one comes forward and is left kneeling alone—rise and stand beside those who kneel.

Place your hand upon the person's head or shoulder.

Hear the words of this prayer,

"Jesus Christ, our savior and shepherd,

fill you with love, mend you with mercy,

and grant you peace."

Those who receive oil upon your forehead in the sign of the cross, a reminder of the baptismal grace that forgives, frees, and heals us, hear the assuring words, "You are God's child, now and always."

The Lord is our shepherd, we need nothing more. Come, you who are filled with anxiety, regret, or fear. Christ leads you beside still waters.

Come, you who long for reconciliation between peoples and nations. God has set a table in the presence of our enemies, where we can feast with them on Christ's mercy.

Come, you who walk in death's dark valley and you who accompany others along the sorrow road. God's comfort is yours.

You may come to the cross to kneel or sit as beside still waters. In song and prayer, our bodies, our breath, our hearts, our hands, and our voices are joined in God.

Lord, lis-ten to your chil-dren pray-ing, Lord, send your Spir-it in this place;




Lord, lis-ten to your chil-dren pray-ing, send us love, send us pow'r, send us grace.
