
"We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish." Matthew 14:17 (NIV)



Dear faithful servants of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior,

The verse above is from the miracle of the feeding of the multitudes, which is the only miracle found in all four gospel accounts. This story tells us much about who Jesus is. It tells us much about the kingdom of

God he has come to usher in. It tells us much about discipleship. I have been thinking about this miracle and many other parables we have recently had that speak to the kingdom of God. So many, such as the parable of the tiny mustard seed, miniscule crumbs from the master's table, one single pearl ,or the story about a woman putting two small coins in the offering reveal much about God. As in the feeding of the 5,000 God can do great things with very little. Even what our minds may perceive as miniscule are not in the kingdom of God. One mustard seed can go a long way. Five loaves and two fish can feed many.







It's not unlike the photo above it of a single cardinal that would often frequent our porch this spring and early summer. One was enough to remind me of the abundance of God's handiwork. One was enough to fill my heart with gladness. Or how about a single butterfly we might see spreading its wings and radiating its beautiful colors. Or, maybe it's one simple thank you, a few words of encouragement, one handshake or hug, a word of peace, a can of food or two or three, or one offer of forgiveness. Just think how freeing and healing forgiveness is and also a sign of the kingdom of God. With God all things are possible, no matter how big or how small. Book For Adults

Climate change and our effect on the environment is a central news story today. The area of the state of Iowa has been geographically changed more than any other state. *Tending Iowa's Land: Pathways To A Sustainable Future* is a series of essays edited by Cornelia Mutel. Iowa's prairies and wildlands have been transformed into vast agricultural fields. This massive conversion has provided us with food, fiber, and fuel. But it has also robbed Iowa's land of its native resilience and created the envi-

ronmental problems that challenge our everyday lives. This includes polluted waters, increasing floods, degradation of prairie topsoil, compromised natural systems, and climate change. In the book, Iowa scientists and experts outline viable solutions that will benefit agriculture as well as the state's human and wild residents. Also included are articles by farmers and others actively engaged in agriculture. Of special interest to us in the West Branch area is an article by Ken Fawcett, *Farming For The Future: A Personal Story*.

Book For Teens

When Stars Are Scattered by Victoria Jamieson and Omar Mohamed is about family, home, and the day to day life of a refugee. This is an important topic today as there are millions of refugees in the world today as a result of the many conflicts that are taking place. There are more refugees now than at any time since World War II. Life is hard in the camps, never enough food, achingly dull, and without access to the medical care that is needed. I found it to be an interesting, informative, engaging graphic novel.

Books For Children

The Fall Of Freddie The Leaf is a story of life for all ages. This is the twentieth anniversary edition of the story by Leo Buscaglia. It is a warm and simple story about a leaf named Freddie. Freddie and his companion leaves change with the seasons. They finally fall to the ground. It is an inspiring allegory illustrating the delicate balance between life and death. Both children and adults are touched by this thoughtful treatment of a sensitive aspect of life.

When Dinosaurs' Die: A Guide To Understanding Death by Laurie Krasny Brown and Marc Brown is the second book this month dealing with grief for children. This book explains in simple language the feelings people may have regarding the death of a loved one. It also includes the ways to honor the memory of someone who has died.




We now have an AED.

The AED is located in the hallway to the Great Hall.








WEDNESDAY WOMEN'S STUDY GROUP




