

Book For Adults

Tim Russert was the host of the program *Meet The Press* and an accomplished journalist. After Tim died unexpectedly, his son Luke kept looking for his father. The result is the book *Look For Me There: Grieving My Fa-ther, Finding Myself.* After eight years covering politics on TV, Luke realized he had no good answer as to why he was chasing his father's legacy. He decided to leave the familiar behind and set out to find his own answers. What started out as a couple of months of travel to de-

compress and reassesses ended up in a three year trip to discover the world and ultimately, to find himself. For anyone unsure about the direction of their life or unsure about how to move forward after a loss, this book is a reflection that offers encouragement to examine our choices, take risks, and discover our truest selves.

Book For Teens

On a spring morning, neighbors Valentina Kaplan and Oksana Sovchenko wake up to an angry red sky. It is 1986, in what is today the Ukraine, and the nuclear power plant at Chernobyl has exploded. Their fathers both work at the plant. This starts *The Blackbird Girls: A disaster that changes lives. A friendship that lasts a lifetime* by Anne Blankman. Before they know it, the two girls who have always been enemies find themselves together on a train. They begin to learn what it means to trust another person. Both of them discover something they have wished for : a best friend. This book discusses many problems: hatred, intolerance, child abuse, and oppression. They are no match for the power of true friendship.

Books For Children

This month's book on relationships and grief is *The Invisible String* by Patrice Karst. When mom tells her children that they are all connected by an Invisible String, the children insist, "That's impossible!" But still, they want to know more. It is an invisible string made of love. Even though you cannot see it, you can feel it deep in your heart and know that you are always connected to the ones you love. This classic for all ages has helped comfort and heal countless readers by easing separation anxiety, loneliness, and loss. It explores the intangible yet unbreakable connections between us all.

At LSI, we celebrate all the ways professional caregivers help children and adults achieve their goals and build meaningful connections in their communities. LSI's Host Homes program is an innovative way Direct Support Professionals serve adults with disabilities.

Through this program, an individual moves from Supported Community Living into a private family home with a carefully selected Host Homes Provider who provides 24/7 support for the client.

"Working directly with my clients to help them complete goals and work around obstacles is my favorite part of my job," said Erica Hill Murray, a Host Homes Provider at LSI. "I enjoy showing them that there are people in their lives who care about them, are proud of them, and proud to help them."

Erica has helped many clients in the five years she has provided care at LSI, but one client, in particular, has made great strides under her care.

"I worked with a client who wanted to find a job or volunteer position, but she had two obstacles in her way: she had trouble using a computer, and she wasn't confident in her ability to speak in an interview," said Erica. "I offered to look for positions on the computer with her and to call potential employers to explain what she was looking for. After working with her, we found her a volunteer position for a couple of days a week, and she was delighted."

"She thanked me for helping her and said that she was happy that, for once, someone understood her drive to want to work," said Erica. "I like to make a difference – even if it is small. Helping others, no matter at what level, is impactful. I love working at LSI, and I believe my position as a Host Homes Provider has been my favorite position in life."
