#### **Bethany Books**

#### **Book For Adults**

It has been over a year since I have added a book by Beverly Lewis on the Amish of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. The latest book is *The Heirloom*. This book is the prequel to *The Shunning* which is possibly the most famous of Lewis's books. In this book, after her widowed father remarries, nineteen-year-old Clara Bender is no longer needed at home to run his household. Marriage seems like her best hope of moving out. However, there are few young men in her tiny Indiana Amish com-

munity. She comes across letters from her mother's aunt and decides to visit her in Hickory Hollow in Lancaster County. A visit that is supposed to last a week turns into something much longer than that. The two women form a warm bond while working on a quilt and sharing their lives. She decides to stay the summer. Read the book to find out the unexpected turns that take place in her life.

#### **Book For Teens**

Seventh grader Jordan Banks loves nothing more than drawing cartoons about his life. But instead of sending him to the art school of his dreams, his parents enroll him in a private school known for its academics. There he is one of the few kids of color in his entire grade. As he makes the daily trip from home to school he finds himself torn between two worlds and not really fitting into either one. Middle school is hard enough without being the new kid. Read the book to find out the adventures he faces as he learns how to navigate his new school culture. Can he keep his neighborhood friends and stay true to himself?

#### **Book For Children**

We often wonder if we are correct in our prayer life. Even the disciples asked Jesus how it is best to pray. In the book *There's No Wrong Way To Pray* by Rebecca Ninke and Kate E.H. Watson, a mother and 10 years old daughter, team up to answer this question. In the book, a child reflects on prayer, including different ways to pray, things to pray for, and times to pray. The prayers range from silly, wish-like prayers at Christmas to nightly prayers for all children to be fed, sheltered, and loved. She used to believe that there was only one right way to pray. She concludes that now she thinks that there is no wrong way to pray. This book is a helpful guide in dealing with the subject of prayer with children.














#### **Stewardship News**

   All require faithful servants and your financial support, along with the help and guidance of God, to make these possible.






