Dear People of God,

The faithful men who gather Wednesday mornings at 7:00 AM just finished a study from the book of 1 Peter. This book was written to early Gentile converts to Christianity in the Roman province of Asia Minor (modern day Turkey). It was most likely written in the late first century CE, although like many biblical texts that is debatable. These early converts were learning how to live their new life in Christ. How does one live within a family unit in which some still worship pagan deities? How does one live as a follower of Christ under Roman occupation and government? How does one live, when attempting to lead a good and godly life may bring with it struggle and suffering?

Repeatedly in the Old Testament we find God reminding the people of Israel who they are in times of struggle and suffering. They are God's people. They are a "priestly kingdom and a holy nation" (Exodus 19:6); they are "sheep of God's pasture" (Psalm 100:3); they are God's servant whom God has chosen and not rejected (Isaiah 41:9).

In similar manner, the author of 1 Peter is doing the exact same thing. He is instilling in these new converts their identity as called, chosen, and holy people through the saving work of God in Christ Jesus. Never forget, the author seems to proclaim, who you are in the face of peril, opposition and suffering as you try to do good and follow Christ's example.

We have just watched one of the best collegiate basketball careers come to an end. Caitlin Clark will now wear a new jersey that identifies her as a member of the Indiana Fever. I have seen many a social media post lifting up the fact that she will forever be a Hawkeye. Even though the University of Iowa will retire her jersey, it will forever be part of who she is.

As Christians, we don many "jerseys" throughout our lifetimes. Some we place upon ourselves. Some are placed upon us by others. Each says something about who we are: right or wrong, good or bad. But we are always clothed in the "jersey" that reminds us we are "a chosen people, a royal priesthood, God's special possession." As such, we have a mission "to declare the praises of him who called you out of the darkness and into his wonderful light." At times, doing just that may bring with it struggle and suffering. When it does, remember whose you are. Remember the hope we have in Christ Jesus. Remember, we are never alone. The risen Christ is with us! Peace be with you blessed saints! - Pastor Chad

The adult book this month is Faith Begins At Home: The Family Makeover With Christ At The Center by Mark Holman. In the past, faith was a central part of the family's home life. The question becomes "What does this mean for the faith of our children?" The question is not are we passing things on to our children, but what are we passing on to our

children. If we want our children to have a faith that influences the way they live their lives, then we need to be modeling this faith. The home needs to be the primary place where faith is nurtured.

## **Book For Teens**

The teen book for this month is *Unscheduled Grace: 40 Reflections And Prayers For College Students* by Katherine Fick and Matthew Marohl. The authors are campus pastors at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. They deal with college students on a daily basis as a part of their vocation. This book can accompany students through the changes, challenges, and joys of college living, including homework, relationships, stress, vocation, and more. This month's children's book is *All Because You Matter* by Tami Charles and illustrated by Bryan Collier. 




