Bethany Books

Books For Adults

The first book is *The Beauty Of What Remains: How Our Greatest Fear Becomes Our Greatest Gift* by Steve Leder. Steve Leder is the senior rabbi of one of the largest synagogues in the world. He has learned the many ways that death teaches us how to live and love more deeply. The wisdom that he shares in this book is an essential part of living a meaningful life. Even after having sat beside more than a thousand deathbeds as a rabbi, he was not really prepared for the loss of his father. It was only then that Steve Leder, the son, truly learned how death makes life beautiful by giving it meaning and touching us with love that we have not felt before. This book takes us on a journey through the experience of loss that is fundamental to us all.

The second book is I Am Not Sick I Don't Need Help: How To Help Someone Accept Treatment by Xavier Amador. This book addresses the problem of mental illness. Many people are trying to reach someone with serious mental illness or addiction who is in "denial" and most likely refusing treatment and relapsing. Or, if in treatment, is dropping out again and again. This book is written both for people with serious mental illness and those with addiction. Though this book focuses on examples of persons with mental illness rather than addiction, the solutions offered can work for both. The first part of this book provides information about the nature and scope of the problem. Part II introduces LEAP, a communication strategy designed to win the trust of persons who lack insight for the purpose of becoming a "friend" whose advice they will follow. In Part III practical guidance about when and where to secure "assisted treatment" is given. Dr. Amador"s research into poor insight was inspired by his success in helping his brother Henry, who developed schizophrenia, accept treatment. Like many others who had developed this and other disorders, Henry did not believe he was ill. This book is not just a reference guide for mental health and criminal justice professionals but is for family members whose loves ones have been devastated by mental illness.

At the Republican National Convention held last month in Milwaukee, former president Donald Trump selected J.D. Vance to be his vice presidential running mate. Vance is a senator from Ohio and the author of the book *Hillbilly Elegy*. Our church library has a copy of this book and it has good biographical information to his background.

Book For Children

Where Are You From?: The Wonderful Story Of Your Birth by Karine-Marie Amiot and Lucie Minne tells the story of life. It uses language that is appropriate for toddlers and young children who are not quite ready to hear all about the birds and the bees yet. Children will learn that they were lovingly, purposefully created by God, and treasured and loved by their parents. This is a good book for those with little ones who are just beginning to ask, "Where did I come from?"


