Let the favor of the LORD our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands — O prosper the work of our hands! (Psalm 90:17)

Dear people of God,

Psalm 90 is not one I have spent a great deal of time in. I went searching for a verse that seemed appropriate for *God's Work, our Hands* Sunday, which is September 8<sup>th</sup>. The verse above fit the bill. As I read Psalm 90 to better understand the context of this verse, I hear the psalter reminding us of the precious time we have on earth. I also hear we will experience much during that time, including trials and tribulations. Yet, at the end, I hear of God's graciousness to restore us to a right relationship with God. It is God's steadfast love that sustains us. It is God who is at work in us, whose favor is upon us that will "prosper for us the work of our hands." This is a psalm of hope!

Over the years the saints of Bethany, including those who now rest from their labors, have accomplished so much work in the name of Jesus Christ on this annual day of service. And it's not just us, it's congregations throughout the country, which are part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). We are joined together in mission for the sake of the world. We are joined to the body of Christ that is his church on earth. To be a member of the ELCA means many things, including the work of proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ, through word or deed, which is exactly what the Greek root word for evangelical means. The work of the church is to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ. And what is that gospel? It is the good news of God's saving work for the world through the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ (John 3:16). It is the good news that Christ came for all people, especially the most vulnerable among us. It is the good news that while we were still sinners, Christ still came to save us (Romans 5:8). It is the good news that Christ calls us to Himself and uses our hands, our words, our actions to be his body in the world. It is the good news that God's grace is sufficient, and God's power is made perfect in weakness (2 Corinthians 12:9), which is the foolishness of the cross (1 Corinthians 1:18). For it is in the cross we see the gospel of good news Jesus proclaimed and then lived out, there is "no greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." (John 15:13) It is the good news that Jesus is the resurrection and life and all who believe in him shall live (John 11:25).

We will proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ on September 8<sup>th</sup> through the work of our hands. We will proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ through song, the reading of scripture, and the prayers of the church during worship. Please, if you are able, join us for worship at 9:30 am and then be sent in the name of Jesus Christ to do a variety of ministry activities. Many thanks to Jessica Fonseca for organizing the activities, which are located on page 6. 




# **Bethany Books**

#### **Books For Adults**



Lynn Eib. She is a cancer survivor herself and works with cancer patients as an oncology patient advocate. She shares with the reader ideas from her books and experiences. She tells stories of people who have been touched by cancer and gives a positive outlook toward them. She lets the reader know that when God and cancer meet, hope is never far away. Each segment is a daily dose of encouragement.

Surviving After Cancer: living the new normal is by Anne Katz. What is a cancer survivor? With so many people surviving cancer today and living the new normal it has become important to be able to guide survivors and their families through the phases of recovery. Learning to live as a survivor and dealing with both triumphs and the challenges including fear of recurrence, depression, life and occupational stress, the need for surveillance for complications can be confusing and hard. Secondary cancers, relationship issues, diet and exercise are additional concerns. Finding resources to help equip survivors and their families for this new phase can be difficult. This book is an attempt to guide readers through the crucial areas of recovery post-cancer. Additional information is always helpful. Advice that can lead to living a healthy and productive life is valuable. I will talk about additional books on cancer next month that I have found to be helpful on the journey with cancer.

#### **Book For Children**

You Matter is by Christian Robinson. The reader is reminded that no matter what happens or how one feels he or she matters. Illustrations and easy to read text make this ideal for children ages 4-8.







# Lutheran World Relief Personal Care Kits






